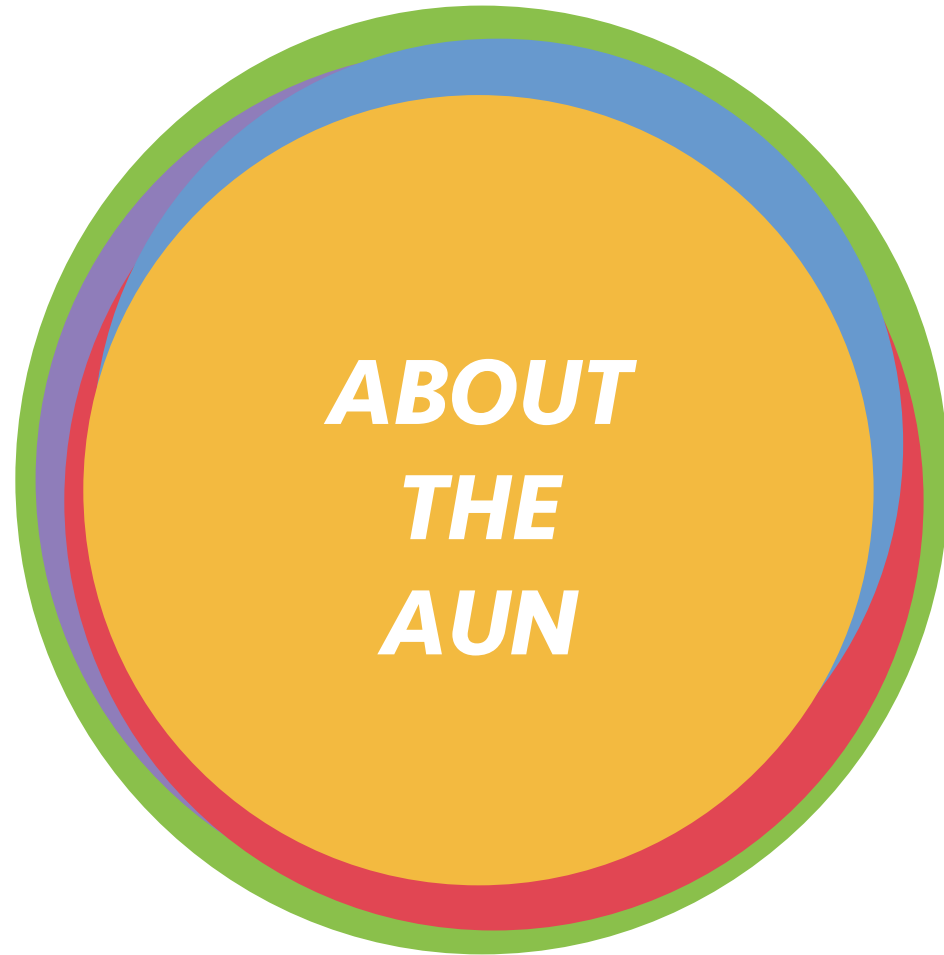

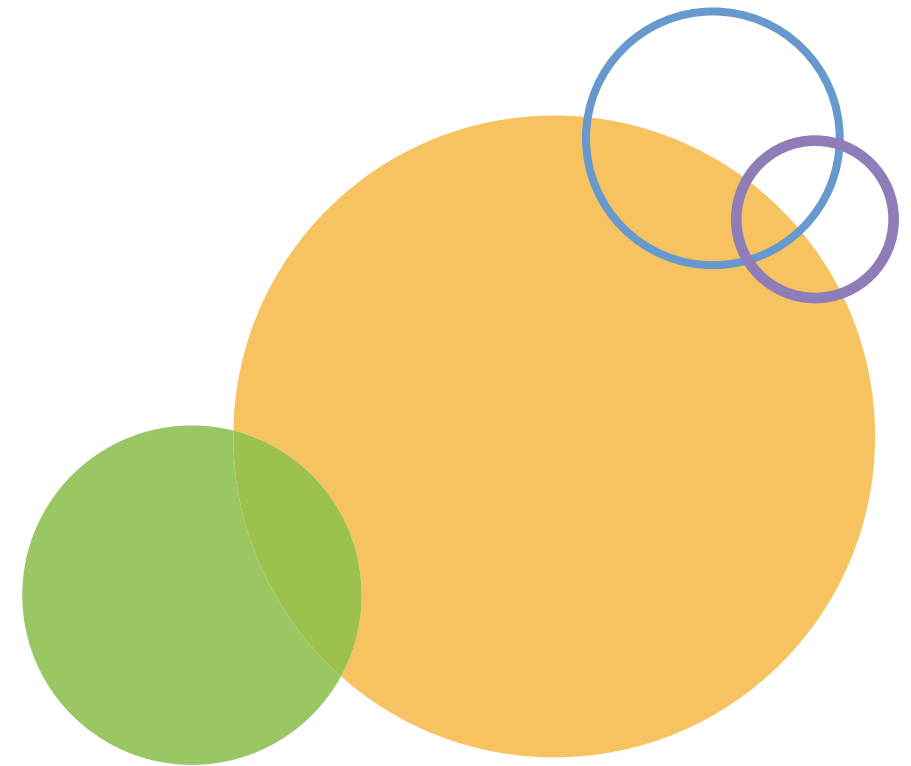

HISTORY & BACKGROUND

The 4th ASEAN Summit in 1992 called for ASEAN Member Countries to help “hasten the solidarity and development of a regional identity through the promotion of human resource development so as to further strengthen the existing network of leading universities and institutions of higher learning in the region.” The idea was later developed into the ASEAN University Network (AUN), which was established in November 1995 with the signing of its Charter by the Ministers responsible for Higher Education from ASEAN countries, the signing of the Agreement on the Establishment of the AUN by the presidents, rectors, and vice-chancellors of participating universities and the formation of the AUN Board of Trustees.

Currently, the Network comprises “**30 core**” member universities, which participate in all AUN activities as the backbone and testing ground of the Network’s projects.

The main objective of the AUN is to strengthen the existing network of co-operation among leading universities in ASEAN by promoting co-operation and solidarity among ASEAN scholars and academics, developing academic and professional human resources, and promoting information dissemination among the ASEAN academic community. Indeed, the network has formed the ASEAN countries’ united quest for academic collaborations in identified priority areas to deepen understanding of the dynamic ASEAN and, accordingly, hasten regional identity and solidarity.

Today, the AUN is a network widely recognised as a vital mechanism for the build-up of an active and renowned ASEAN community in higher education. Given such importance, the AUN was highly commended by the Meeting of Ministers for Education in ASEAN Countries for its achievements in upgrading the capacity of ASEAN human resources and enhancing the quality of education of the AUN member universities. With the strengths and expertise of our members, the AUN can play a major role in broadening the integration of the ten member countries into one cohesive ASEAN Community and narrowing the development gap among them, which are ultimate goals of ASEAN.

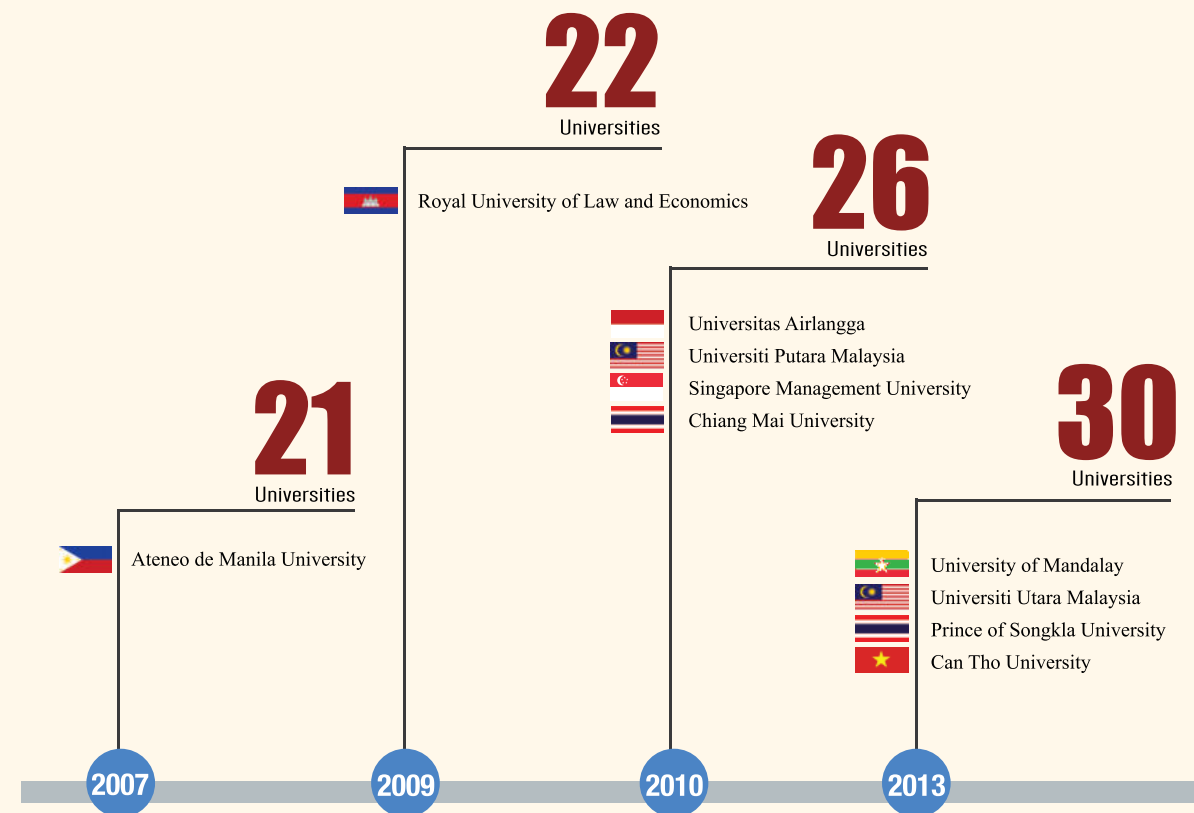
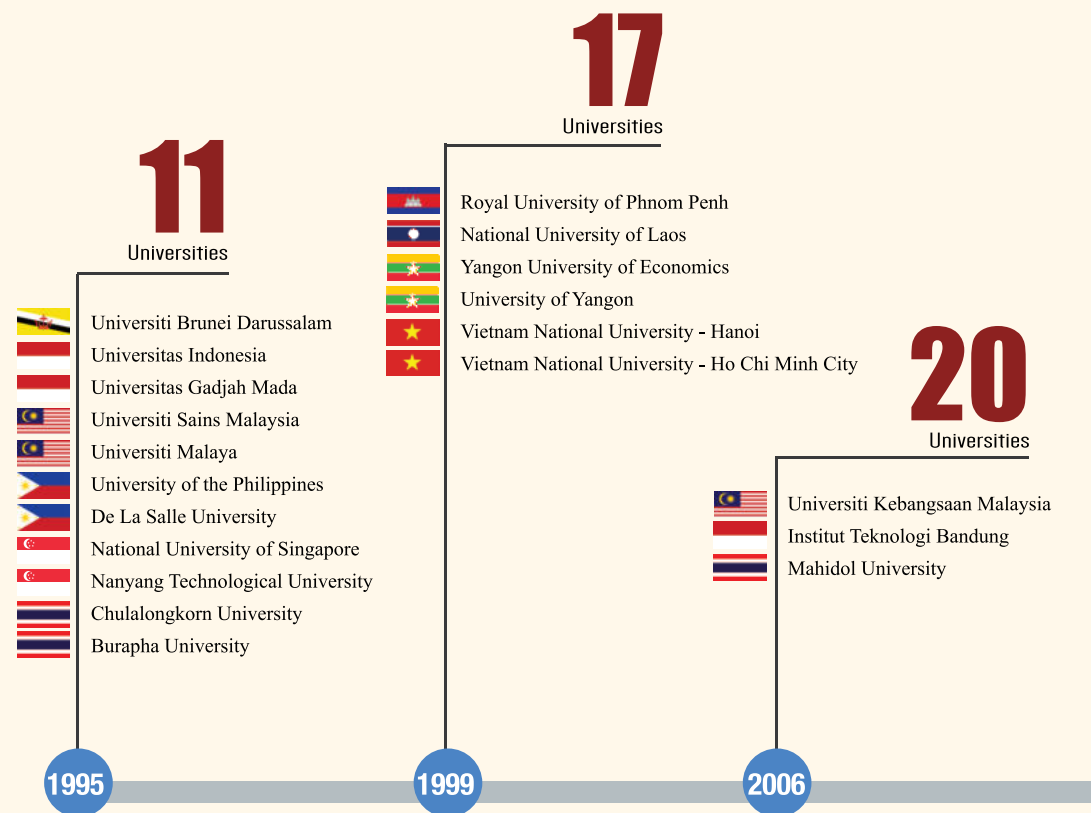

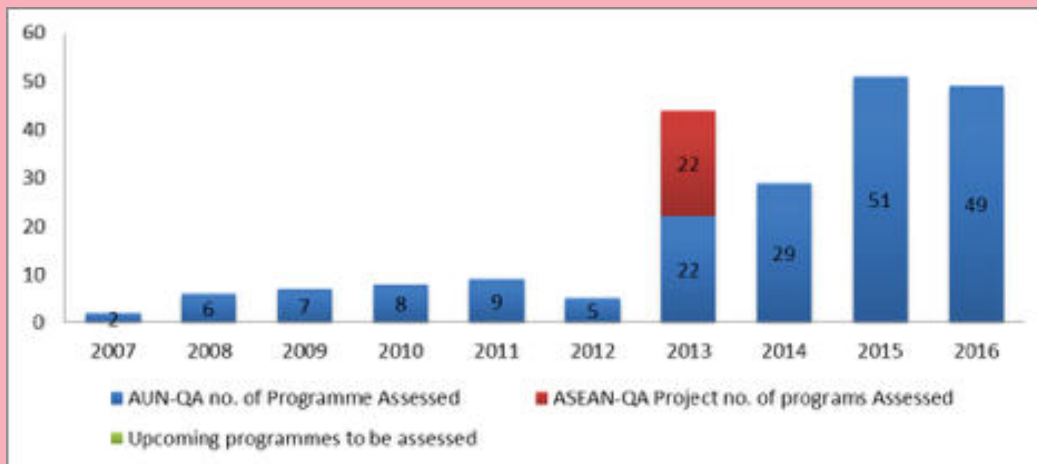


Figure 1: Number of Programmes being assessed per year (As of July 2016)

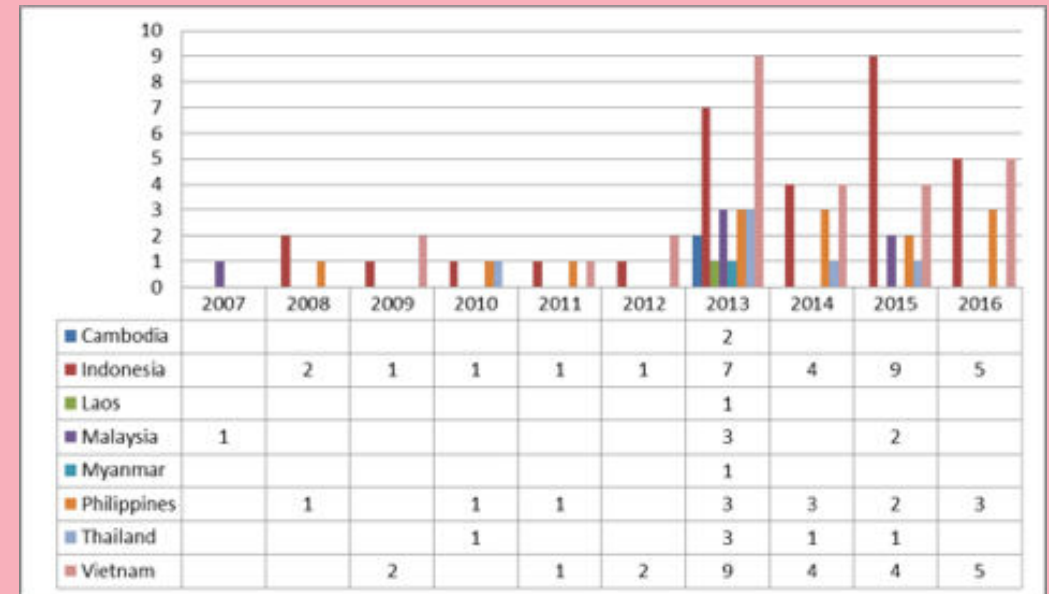


Figure 2: Number of assessment (both programme assessment and ASEAN-QA assessment) based on year and country (as of July 2016)

ASEAN University Network – Quality Assurance (AUN-QA) Network

was established in 1998. Since its inception, AUN-QA and Mechanism has been the standard system practiced within the AUN Member Universities and AUN-QA Associate Member Universities. To date, AUN-QA System has been continuously developed into the regional QA System and Mechanism in higher education institutions

AUN-QA Secretariat currently provides two tiers of training. The AUN-QA Training Course for Accomplishing Programme Assessment (Tier 1) and AUN-QA Assessor Training Workshop (Tier 2). The Tier-1 Training aims to introduce the AUN-QA system and enhance the QA knowledge to the participants. Upon completion of this training course, the trainees obtain the AUN-QA Training Certificates.

The Tier 2 Training workshop incorporates a unique training environment where participants will be given the opportunity to work on a real self-assessment report (SAR) and observe the “live” AUN-QA Assessment at a reputable university. The workshop is facilitated by AUN-QA Experts with extensive experiences in AUN-QA systems and quality assessment in higher education.

Both public run trainings are open to applicants from AUN Member Universities, AUN-QA Associate Member Universities and non-AUN Member Universities.

During August 2015 – June 2016, AUN-QA Secretariat has organised five Tier 1 and one Tier 2 training workshops and trained 226 trainees from 5 ASEAN Countries

Key Discussion Agenda

1. The Establishment of AEC Thematic Network which aims to strengthen research collaborations between universities in ASEAN and industries on pertinent AEC issues, to facilitate exchanges of experts between universities in ASEAN and industries, as well as to deepen the engagement of universities in ASEAN and industries with policy formulation and implementation.

2. The revision of the AUN Charter, the Meeting took note of the results of the Task Force Meeting on AUN Charter revision, held on 20 August 2014, in Bangkok. One of the proposed key revisions of the AUN Charter was to reflect the clear links between ASEAN Education Ministers Meeting (ASEM) and AUN, particularly in the area of governance. As such, it was suggested for the AUN Charter to have a structure that provided clear governing oversight of the Education Ministers and distinguishable roles of the government vis-à-vis the universities.

3. The revision of AUN-QA Guide Book: In rising to the challenges of the ASEAN community, AUN-QA has to be bold and forward looking in advocating a harmonised framework for quality assurance and quality improvement in higher education within and outside ASEAN. To this end, AUN-QA Network has to ensure that its quality assurance framework and documentation remain relevant and current. The Revision Workshop for "A Guide to AUN-QA Assessment at Programme Level" was carried out on 15 May 2015, and this third version of the guidebook is the fruit of the documentation review by a team of experts from AUN-QA Network.

4. The agreement on the teaching and learning strategies and approaches to set up of the platform of good practices, innovation, and strategic framework including the T&L repository containing information, examples, good practices, and teaching innovation to drive forward the changes in teaching and learning in universities.



31st AUN Board of Trustees Meeting

National University of Singapore hosted the 31st ASEAN University Network (AUN) Board of Trustees Meeting in Singapore on 31 July 2015. During the opening ceremony, Prof. Tan Chorh Chuan, President of National University of Singapore delivered the welcome remark on behalf of the three AUN members of Singapore. He also expressed his appreciation to the AUN for its strong effort to promote cooperation in ASEAN. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Pinita Ratananukul, Secretary General, the Office of Higher Education Commission, Thailand, and the Chairperson of the AUN Board of Trustees delivered the opening remark which he congratulated the AUN on the success of its activities and called for greater efforts and active contributions from all AUN member universities and other universities in ASEAN.

At the one-day intensive meeting, the discussion focused and reviewed the progress of the AUN activities, highlighted the progress on AUN-ACTS Scheme of promoting people-to-people linkage and also updated on AUN Youth Mobility activities, particularly the cooperation between the AUN and Kyoto University Student Mobility Programme toward Human Security Development and its success in the implementation of the Double Degree Programme and Joint Supervision Programme. The meeting acknowledged also the success of the AUN-QA network which today is open for Associate Membership that is endorsed by the AUN Board of Trustees Meeting. Currently the AUN-QA Associate

Members consist of 28 Universities (non-AUN Members as of July 2015) from 7 ASEAN Countries. The meeting also endorsed the proposed additional item in the current AUN Strategic Plan (2016-2018) namely "Teaching and Learning" that emphasise on a strategic framework for the collaboration of teaching and learning innovation.

With partnership and the traditional spirit of ASEAN, the 31st AUN-BOT Meeting was successfully organised. The next meeting will be held in, Thailand in August 2016.

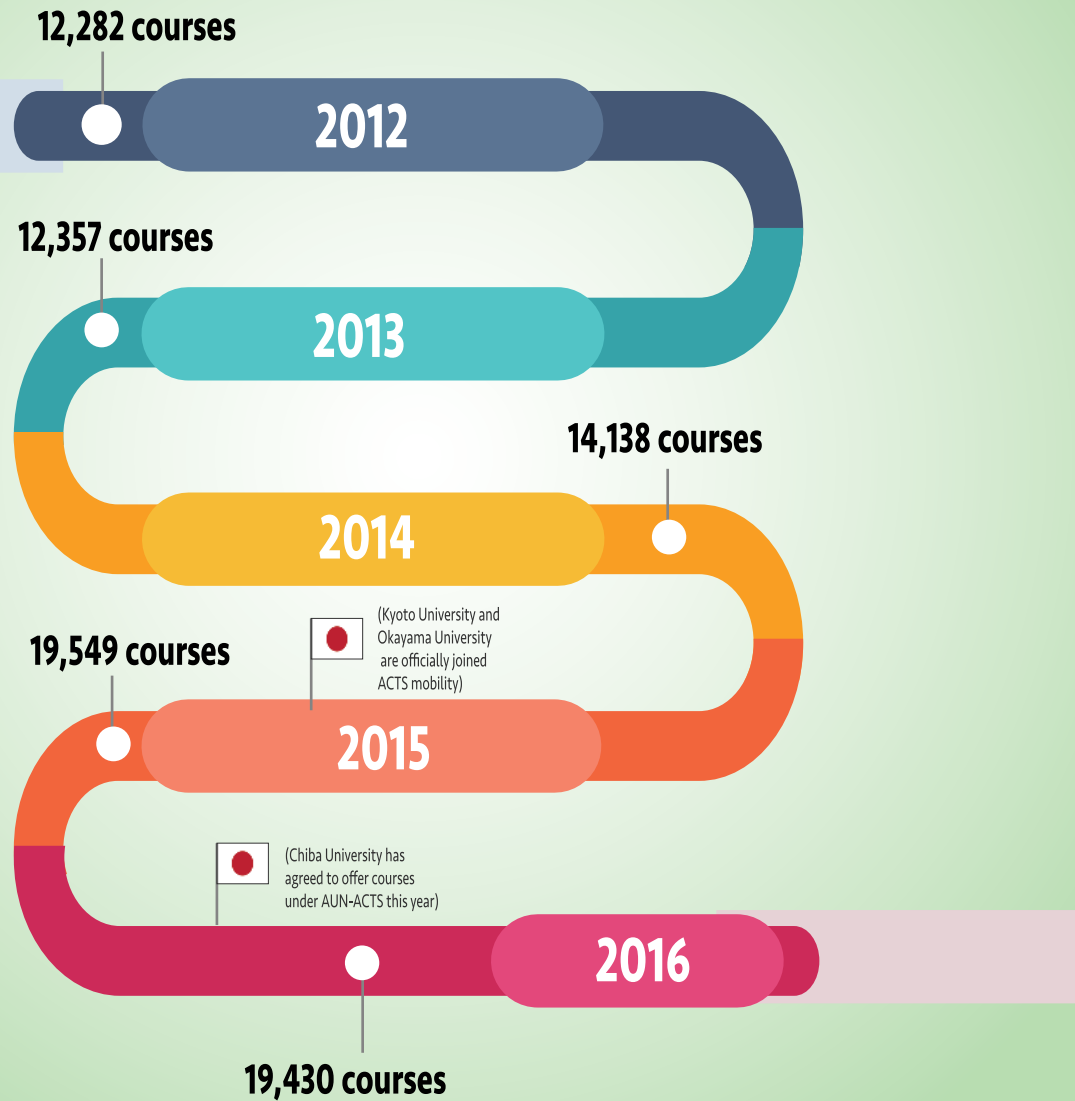

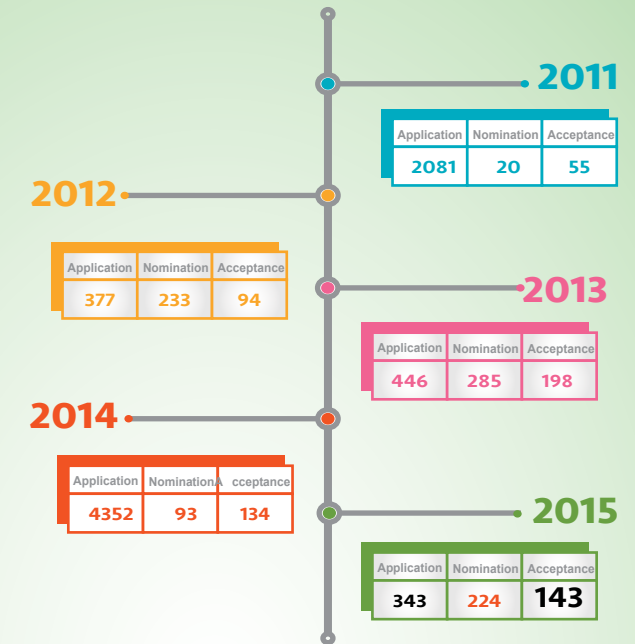
Timeline of courses offered under ACTS scheme

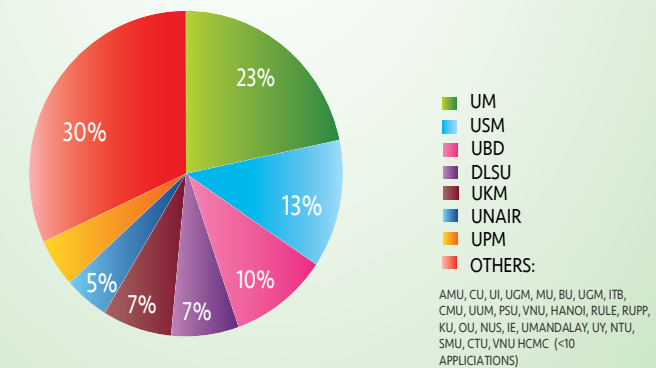

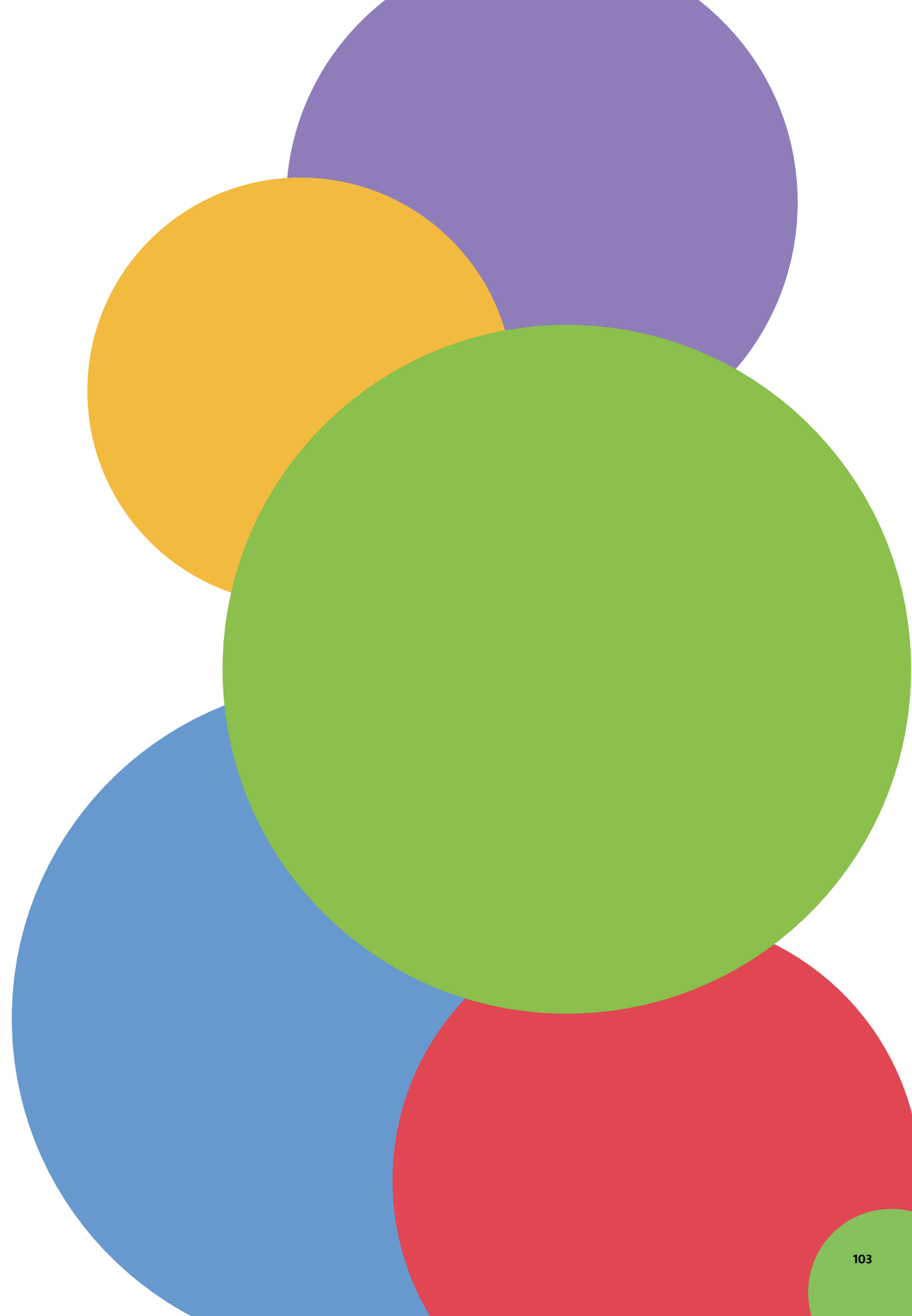

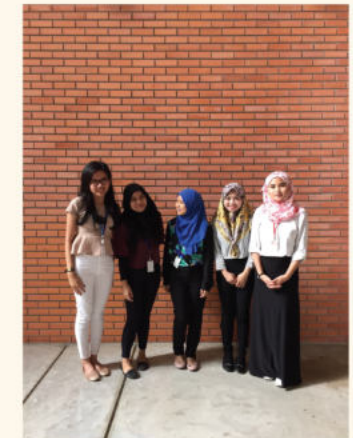

The ASEAN University Network (AUN) was officially established as an autonomous organisation in 1995 under the umbrella of ASEAN and the mandate of Ministers responsible for higher education in ASEAN. The 6th of November, 2015 marked the 20 years of the establishment of the AUN. 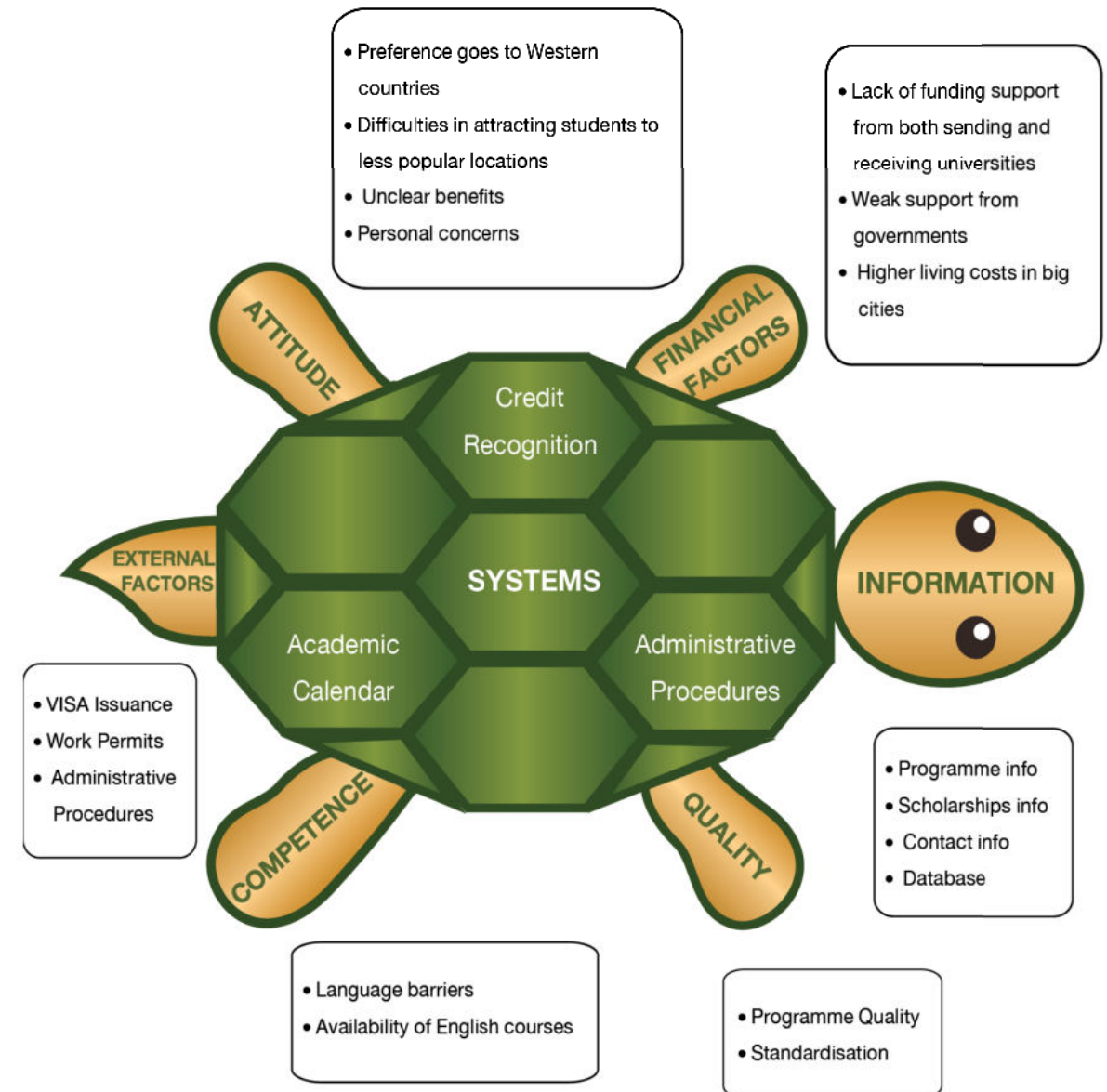
The AUN Co-Production Model

A Reflection of the Cross-Border Collaboration in ASEAN and ASEAN+1



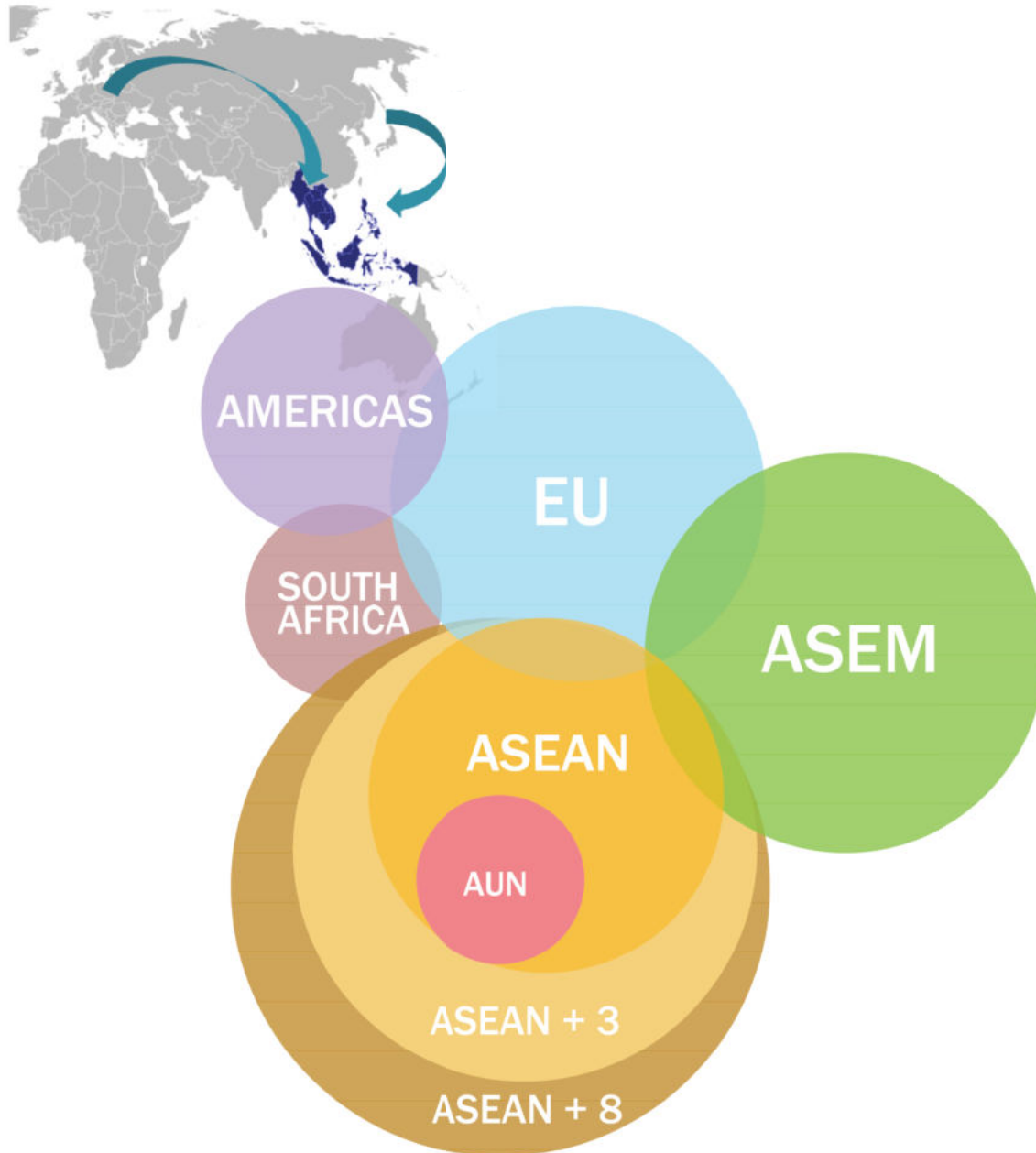
“Measures of the Implementation of Mobility”

What is ACTS?



ACTS Comprises of 3 Components:

- Grading scales
- Online list of available courses
- Online application system

ACTS will be a student-centered system based on students' workloads in terms of the achievement of learning outcomes. The system has been designed in order to accommodate differences in use among AUN universities in grading conversion systems when students participate in the exchange programme at an AUN Member University for the duration of 1-2 semesters.

How Does ACTS Work?

By applying for the ACTS, credits that students earn during the exchange study at the Host University will be collected and will be automatically transferred back to the Home University when the exchange period ends.

- Students will receive the credits assigned from a course that they earn in the Host University during the exchange period.

The ACTS Application Process for Students:

Step 1: Getting started

1. Go to the ACTS website <http://acts.ui.ac.id/>
2. Choose your preferred courses that are available up to 19, 549 courses on ACTS website (please see the Academic Calendar of the host university that match with your university)
3. Register to the online system and complete the application form
4. Print and send the application form to the International Relations Office (or any authorized body) at your university, along with the supporting documents to be reviewed
5. Wait for the confirmation and approval from Host University (your destination), the confirmation and notification email will be sent to you approximately within one month

(Note: students who meet the criteria set up by the host will be selected to participate in the exchange programme)

Step 2: When your application has been approved by Host University

1. Download the “Learning agreement” at <http://acts.ui.ac.id/>
2. Complete and have your “Learning agreement” document signed
3. Upload the completed agreement with signature of applicant and faculty Dean or authorized person to the ACTS system

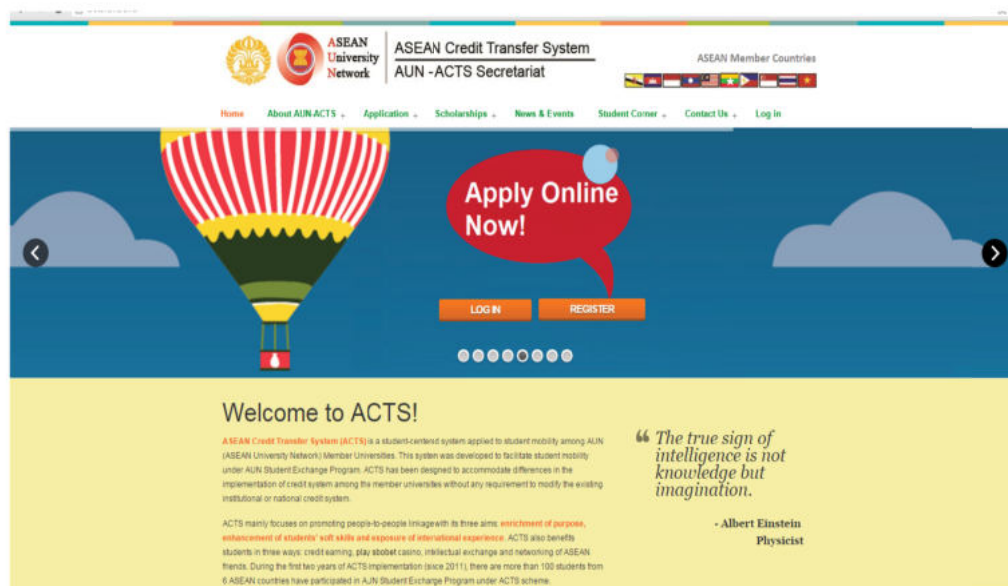
After the end of the exchange programme

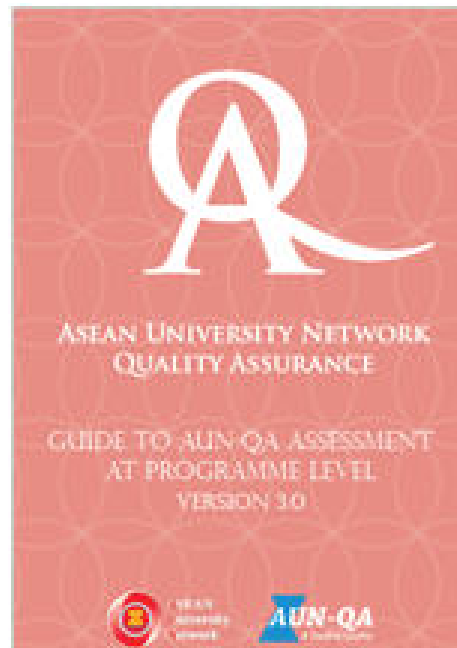

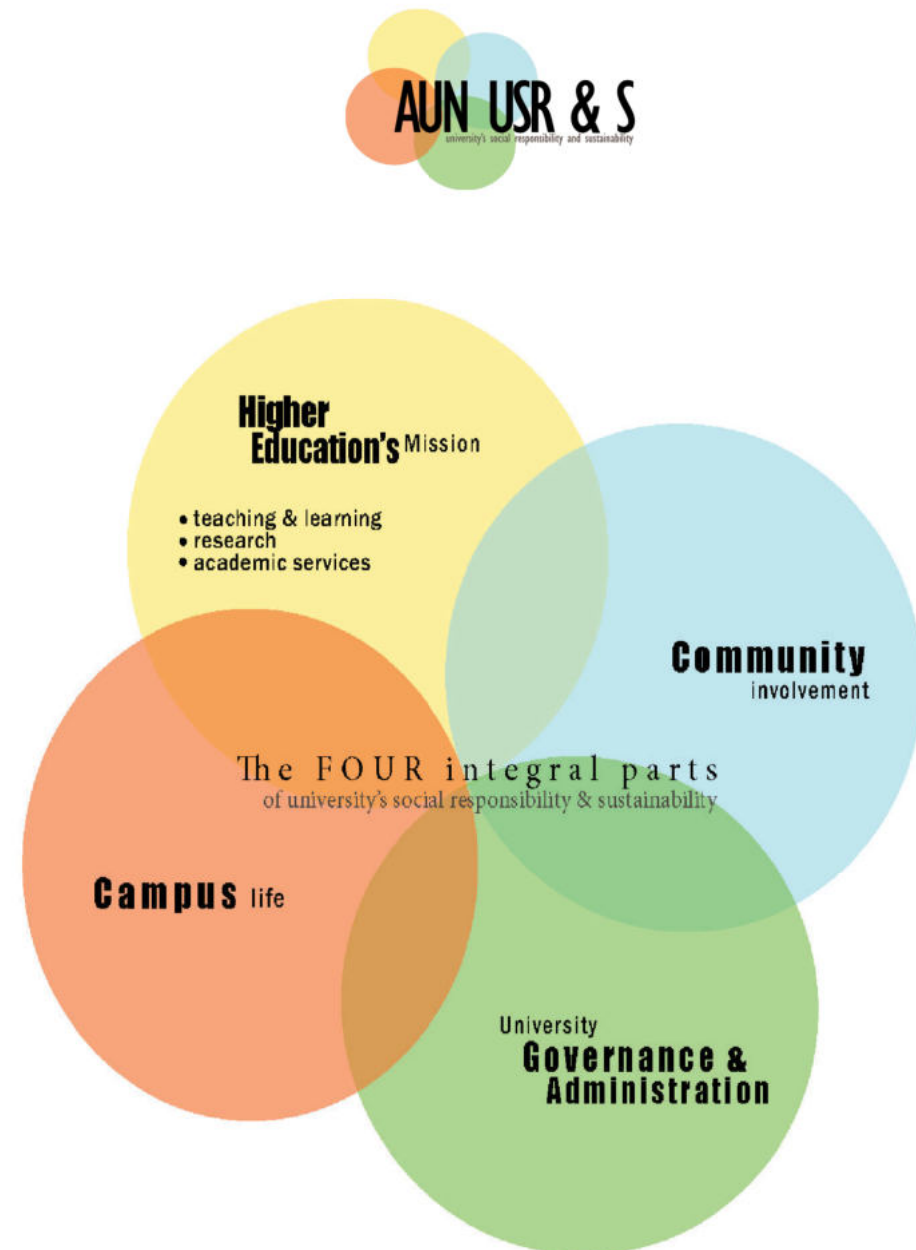
