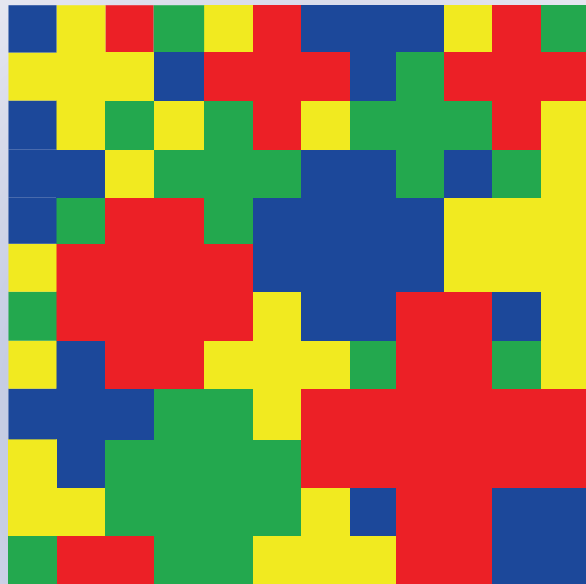

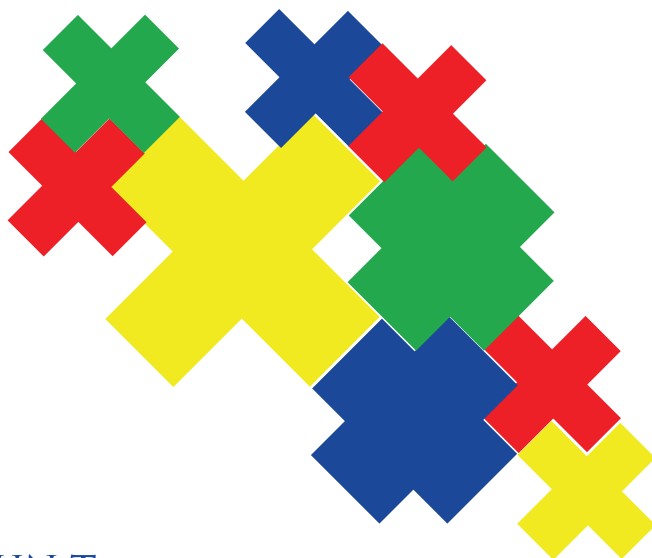

AUN TALKS

ASEAN University Network Secretariat, on behalf of its 26 member universities, thematic networks and partners, conveys its greetings to everyone. It is really true that time passes quickly for those who are tasked with many programmes as it is again time for the annual report of the network. It has been indeed a productive year and in this section, we are pleased to walk you through the 2012-2013 annual report of the AUN.

Commitment has probably been one of the highlights of this year. More and more universities in the region finally recognize the vital role of Quality Assurance in ensuring the quality of education in the region. In the era of globalization where mobility is seen as a common trend, especially in education, ensured quality of education with internationally recognized benchmarks and standards is very important.

The year 2012 has been ended and 2013 has been welcomed with series of AUN Quality Assurance related events. AUN conducted a total of 6 trainings, from August to December 2012, in the form of “train the trainers” of university personnel in charge of QA in CLM (Cambodia, Lao PDR and Myanmar) countries with the full support of Asian Development Bank (ADB).

It aims to assist universities in CLM to develop and set up their QA using the AUN QA system.

Collaboration is a powerful tool that binds the region despite its diversity. Sharing knowledge and information is one of the flagship roles of AUN. This year, AUN became the first organisation which successfully developed the ASEAN Studies Course for the Undergraduate Level. It was developed with the guidance and assistance of ASEAN studies experts in the region and at present, 21 teaching modules for undergraduate are now available in a form of e-resources, accessible and downloadable for free on the AUN website.

Furthermore, this initial success has been recognized by Asian Development Bank (ADB) to ensure the continuous development of this project, ADB has agreed to provide financial support to share this knowledge with CLM countries by conducting AUN ASEAN Studies Training Programme for Academic Staff in CLM Countries with the theme, **“Building the Intellectual Capital for the Teaching and Learning of ASEAN Integration and Asian Regionalism.”** The series of trainings are planned to be conducted next year through a 5-day Training programme in CLM countries. The updates will be provided by AUN Secretariat when they become available.

Expansion is inevitable especially in the era of interdependence, thus AUN continuously commits to ensure healthy collaboration not just in the region but with its dialogue partners as well. Thus in the area of ASEAN+3 Cooperation, ASEAN+3 University Network (ASEAN+3 UNet) successfully concluded its 1st Rectors’ Meeting last November 2012. As a result, the Presidents/Rectors/ Vice-Chancellors of the ASEAN and the Plus Three member universities agreed and signed the Memorandum of Understanding on the creation of the ASEAN+3 University Network Terms of Reference (ToR) for the establishment of the network. The meeting has now been set forth in the cooperation scheme for policy level and it would not have been realised without the support and cooperation of each of the participating universities.

Strengthening the network is as important as expansion. AUN does not just expand its dialogue partners but AUN also commits to strengthening its existing collaboration. In support, this year has been another year that AUN renewed its commitment through new collaboration expansion particularly with Japan.

The Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Sciences and Technology (MEXT) announced grants to support long term projects for 5 years from 2013–2017 with the following grounds: Each adopted project must be in partnership with consortiums among universities in Japan and ASEAN to implement exchange programmes with credit transfer and grade management schemes that will facilitate student exchange between ASEAN and Japanese students.

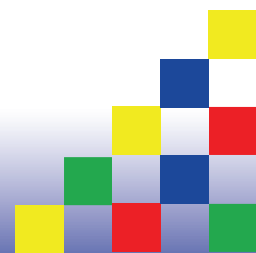
As a response, AUN–Kyoto Student Mobility on Human Security Development Programme has been proposed and adopted. The project kicked off last 22 January 2013 aiming to develop the HSD (Human Security Development) curriculum with the credit transfer system between AUN and Kyoto University and the realisation of the double degree programme on HSD among the participating universities.

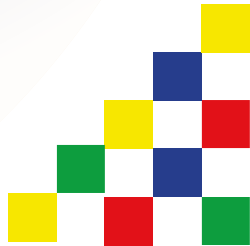
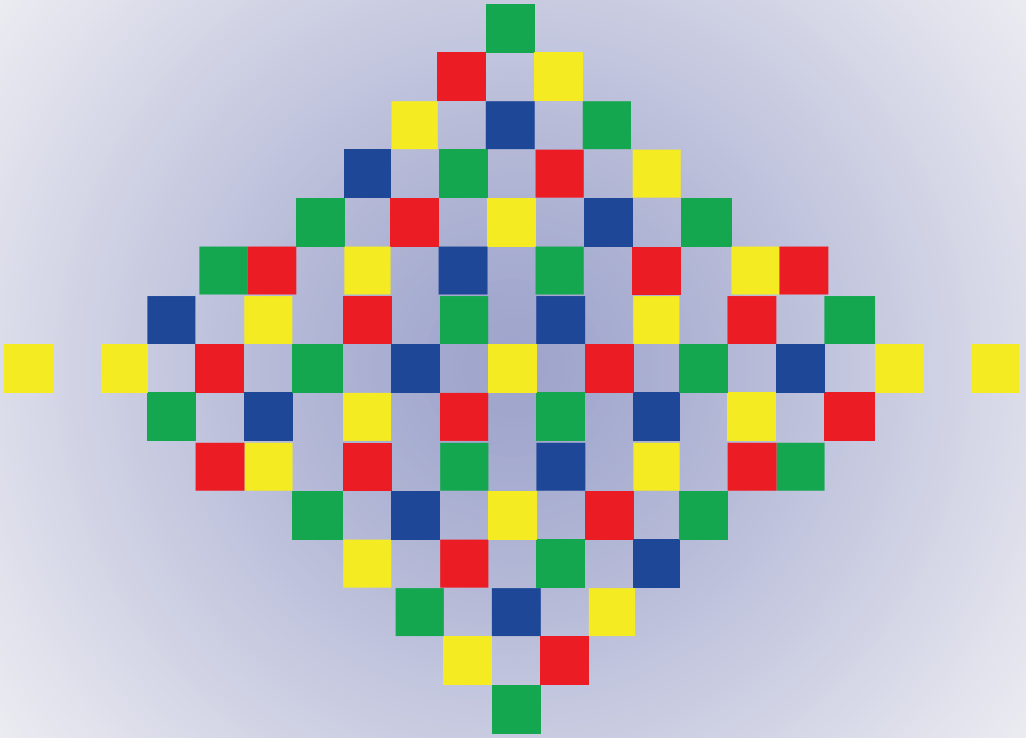
In addition, cooperation between AUN and SUN/SixERS (Six National Universities in Japan) has been established as well. SUN/SixERS is a network of six national universities and the international education and research system in Japan which composes of Chiba University, Niigata University, Kanazawa University, Okayama University, Nagasaki University and Kumamoto University. As a result, AUN and SUN/SixERS had the policy decision makers meetings during the AUN–SUN/SixERS Vice–Presidents’ Meeting held last 22 April 2013 to forge possible partnerships toward the field of health promotion through student mobility, student placement, and internships in the near future. All these would never have been achieved without the help of AUN member universities, dialogue, and collaborative partners. Thus AUN Secretariat extends its heartfelt and sincere gratitude to everyone who has contributed, in one way or another, to the realization of these projects and collaborations.

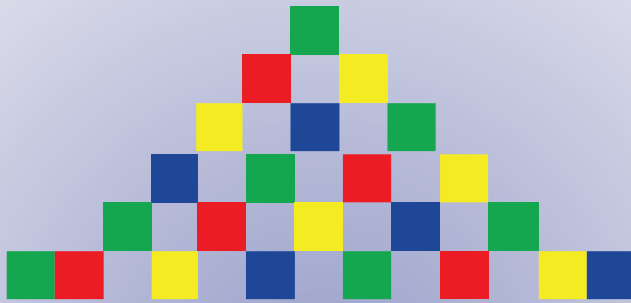

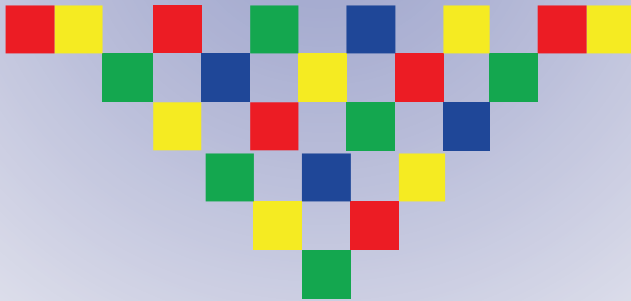

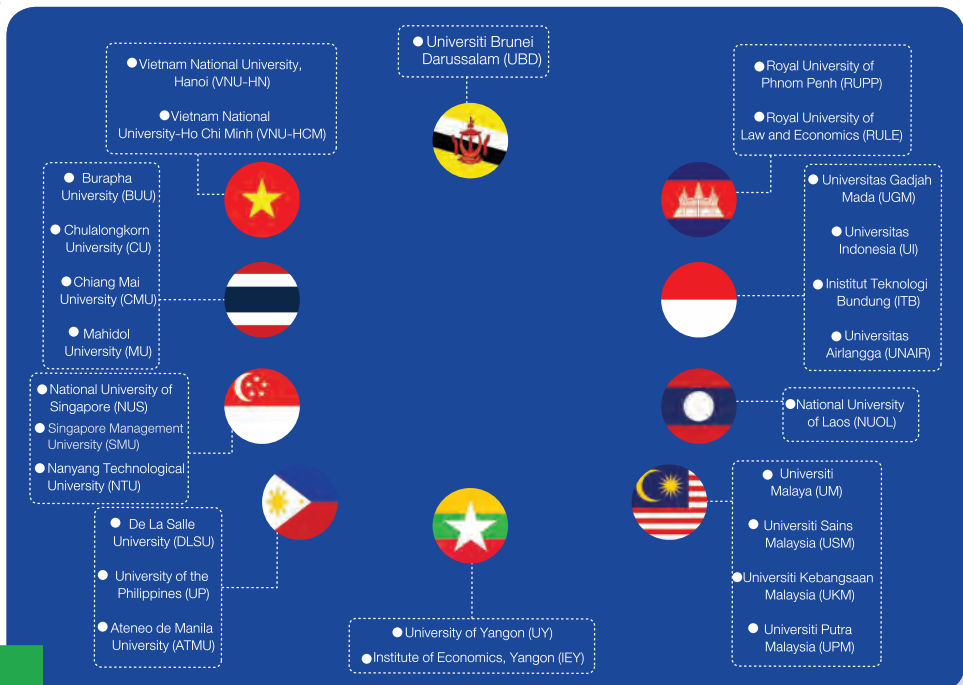
ASEAN UNIVERSITY NETWORK (AUN) IN BRIEF

During the 4th ASEAN Summit in 1992, ASEAN leaders called for the strengthening of the region through the promotion of human resource development and higher education. This aspiration has led to the signing of the Charter of the ASEAN University Network and thus the establishment of ASEAN University Network in November 1995 with the AUN Secretariat as the main coordinating and monitoring agency established in Bangkok, Thailand. Since its establishment, AUN, the network of leading universities, has been serving as ASEAN's implementing agency in the field of higher education for the region's move towards ASEAN Community. In terms of organisational structure, the structure can be categorised into 3 levels.

Firstly, AUN Board of Trustees (AUN-BOT) serves as policy-making body comprised of:

- 10 university representatives, from each ASEAN Country, designated by the government of 10 ASEAN Countries
- The Secretary-General of ASEAN
- The Chairperson of AUN Board of Trustee (Secretary-General of the Office of the Higher Education Commission, Thailand)
- The Chairperson of Senior Official Meeting on Education (SOM-ED)
- The Director of Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organisation (SEAMEO)
- The Executive Director of the AUN Secretariat

At the implementation level, AUN Member Universities participate and implement the programmes and activities under AUN. Currently, AUN membership has extended to 26 Member Universities as follows:



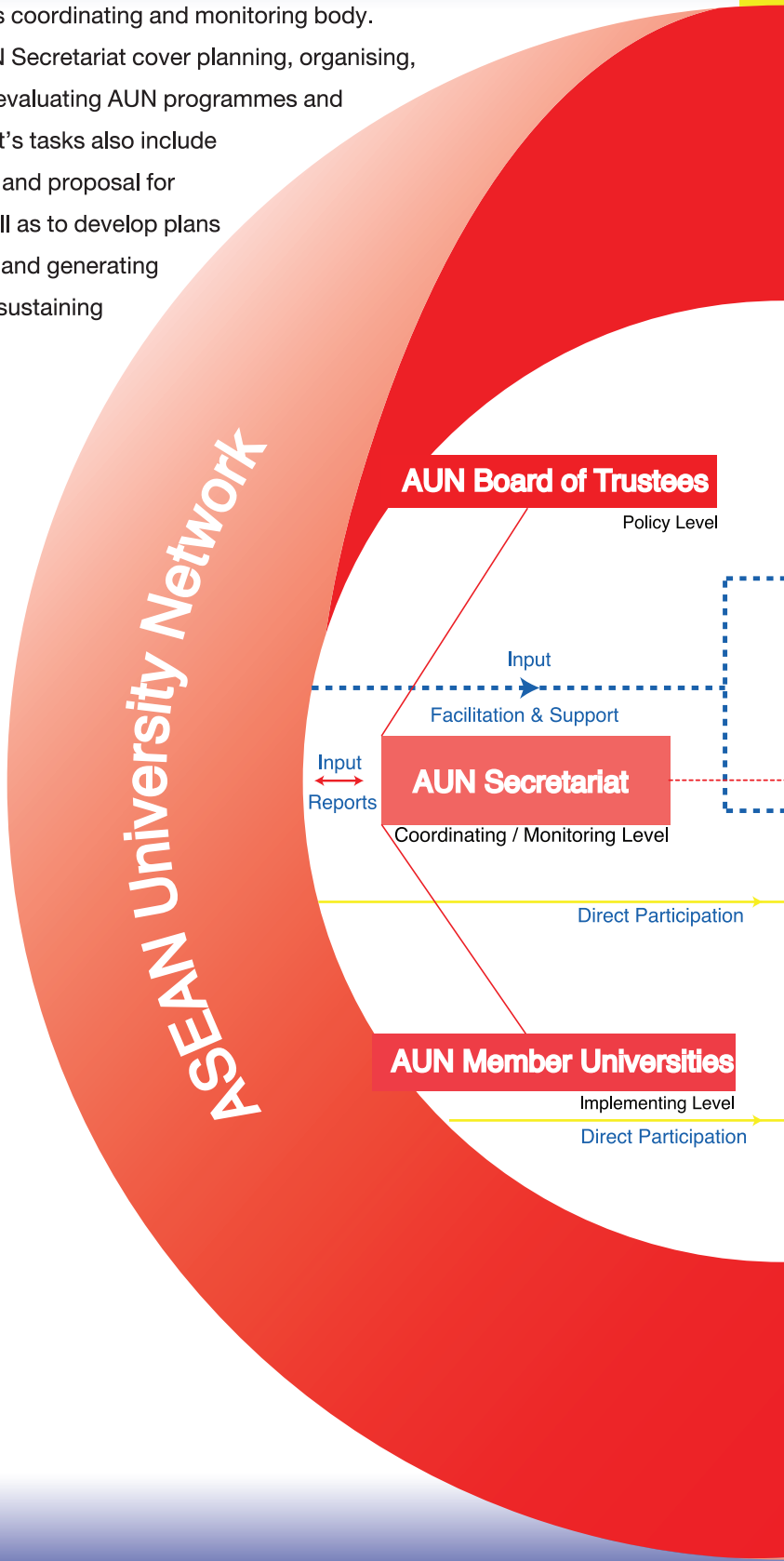

The AUN Secretariat serves as coordinating and monitoring body. The main functions of the AUN Secretariat cover planning, organising, coordinating, monitoring and evaluating AUN programmes and activities. The AUN Secretariat's tasks also include developing ideas, innovations and proposal for cooperation under AUN as well as to develop plans and mechanisms for sourcing and generating funds for self-reliant and self-sustaining operation of AUN.



AUN works closely with the ASEAN Secretariat in reporting progress and proposing initiatives for further intra-regional and inter-regional cooperation in higher education. On regional policy level, AUN has directly participates in the Senior Official Meeting on Education (SOM-ED) and ASEAN Education Ministers Meeting (ASED). In these two levels of policy meetings, AUN reports its progress and contribute its inputs and initiative to the meetings. In addition, the works and progress of AUN activities are also being reported to ASEAN Socio-Cultural Community Council (ASCC (SOCA) and ASEAN Coordinating Council (ACC) through ASEAN Secretariat. At the summit level, the reported progress of AUN is included as the inputs at ASEAN Summit for acknowledgement, endorsement and further recommendations.

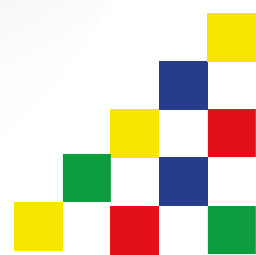
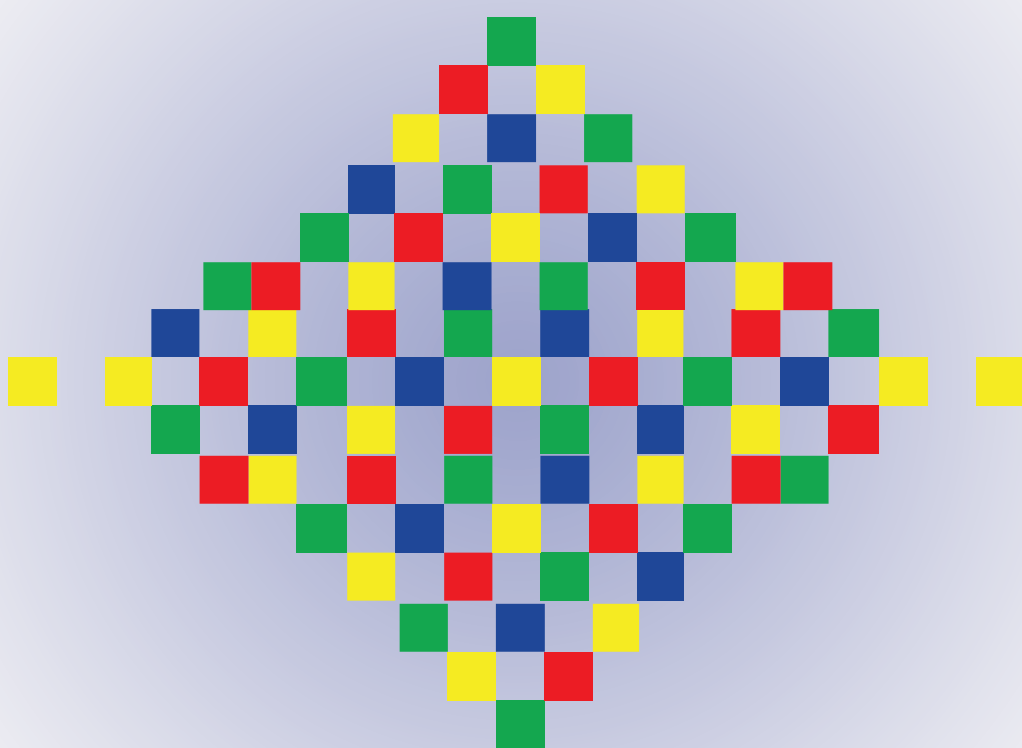


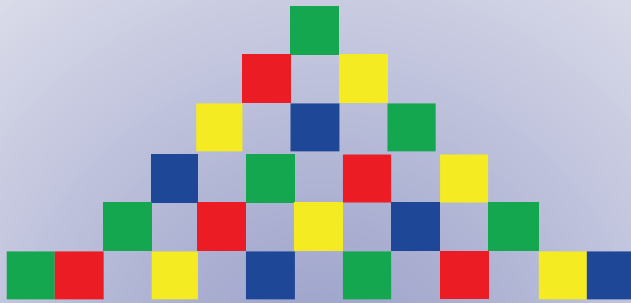




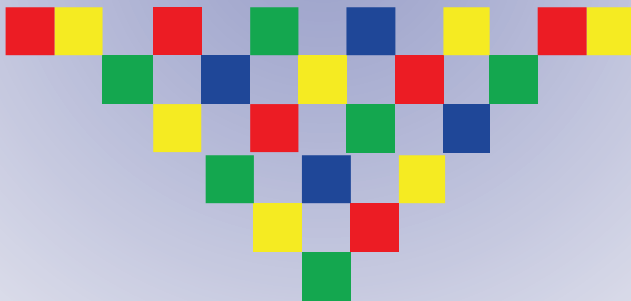

AUN STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

IN BRIEF:

The Programme promotes the ASEAN student mobility of students at both undergraduate and graduate level among AUN Member Universities by providing scholarships to students to study at AUN Member Universities for a period of a semester up to one academic year and also the full degree programme.










DELIVERABLES:

We offered **151** scholarships for AUN Member Universities, providing more than **854** international students mobility within AUN Member Universities.

In addition, each year **130** scholarships are available for students under the AUN ACTS Scheme, currently, **101** students are under the ASEAN Credits Transfer System (updated on June 2013).

CHINA/AUN SCHOLARSHIP



IN BRIEF:

The **China/AUN Scholarship** is a full scholarship programme under the ASEAN-China Academic Cooperation and Exchange Programme, fully supported by the Ministry of Education of P.R. China. Initiated in 2008, this annual programme offers 20 full scholarships to non-Chinese citizens from ASEAN member countries to pursue their Master's and Doctoral degrees in China.

The application opens every year from February to April. In this regard, AUN Secretariat will perform as the focal point for the application and the China Scholarship Council (CSC) will be responsible for the selection process. Admission Notice from CSC will be submitted to AUN Secretariat by the end of July for the announcement.

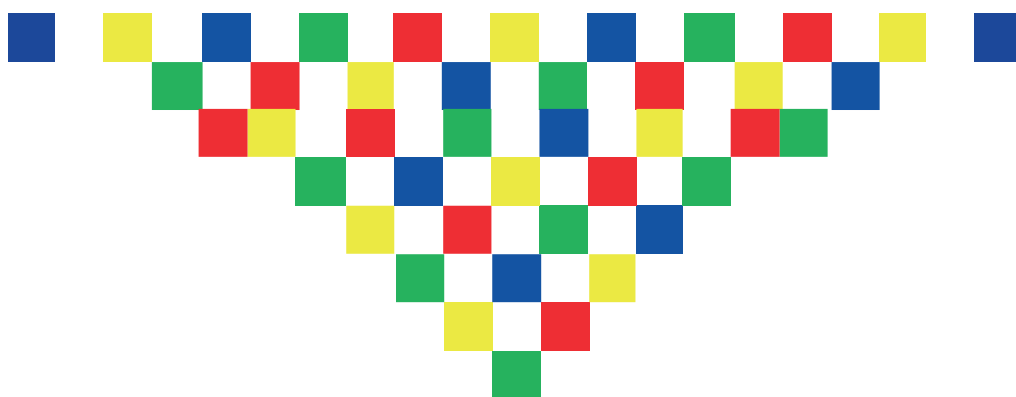
DELIVERABLES:

"Obtaining a scholarship to pursue a doctoral degree abroad is one of my wishes that came true because of the kind consideration and cooperation from the Chinese Government and the Office of the AUN Secretariat. IN BRIEF:

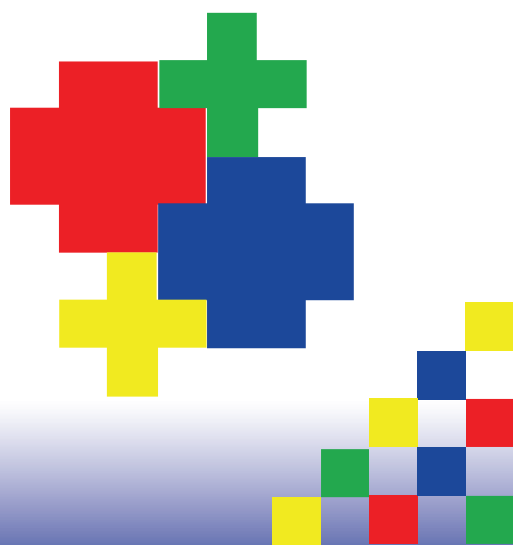
The M.A. Programme in Korean Studies is a project run with the cooperation of Chulalongkorn University, Seoul National University and the ASEAN University Network, with funding support from the ASEAN-ROK Special Cooperation Fund.

The programme is taught mainly by professors from Seoul National University and Chulalongkorn University. Classes are conducted at Chulalongkorn University except for one fall or spring semester when the students are requested to take two elective courses and Korean lessons at Seoul National University. These will be jointly supervised by professors from the two universities.

Since the programme initiation in 2008, AUN has been granting 25 scholarships to the graduate students from 7 ASEAN countries. The current batch of students are now exploring their live experiences in Korea before continuing their 2nd semester at Chulalongkorn University in July 2013.

ASEAN MILLENNIUM LEADERS: CLMV STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAMME 2012



IN BRIEF:

The ASEAN Millennium Leaders College Student Exchange Programme is considered as one of the most active cooperation between ASEAN and the Republic of Korea (ROK), successfully implemented since 2001. The programme received very positive response and active participation from all ASEAN nations in collaboration with Daejeon University and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade, ROK.

This year's batch were mainly given to the students of CLMV (Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar and Vietnam) countries to bridge the gap of development by enhancing and opening opportunities to the future leaders of these countries. Students in the field of Social Science and ICT related field were given opportunities to study as an exchange student at Daejeon University for one academic year. The scholarship covers the tuition fees, accident insurance, accommodation, meals, round-trip ticket and USD 300 monthly stipend.

Daejeon University has developed the international courses for the 20 exchange students and all classes were taught in English by Korean instructor. In addition, students will be given a chance to attend a 2-month internship programme at leading organizations in Korea including: United Nations-Asian and Pacific training Centre for Information and Communications Technology for Development (UN APCICT), Korea Advanced Institute of Science and Technology (KIST), Korea-ASEAN Center, Korea Institute of Nuclear Safety (KINS), Korea Nuclear International Cooperation Foundation (KONICOF), Korea Atomic Energy Research Institute, amongst others.









This year's batch marked the 10th year of successful operation of the programme since its first operation in 2001. The project is jointly funded by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MOFAT), ASEAN Secretariat and Daejeon University in cooperation with the AUN Secretariat.

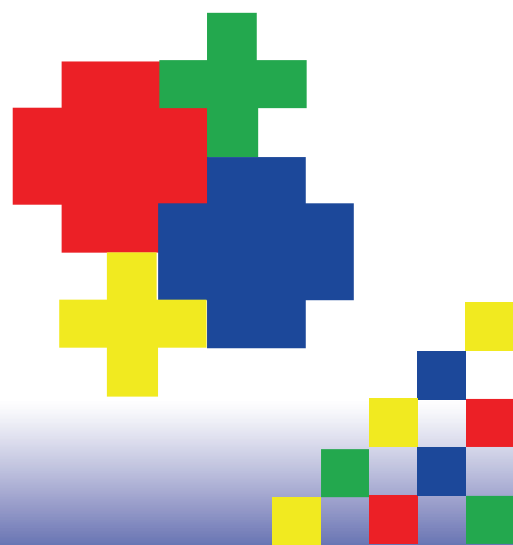

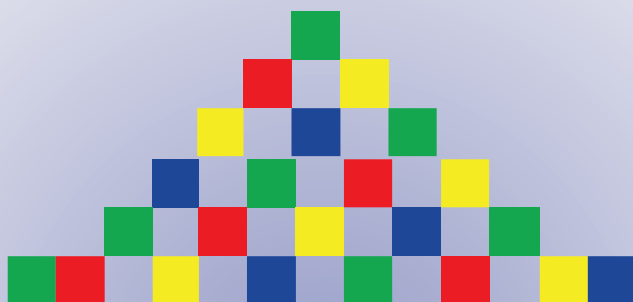

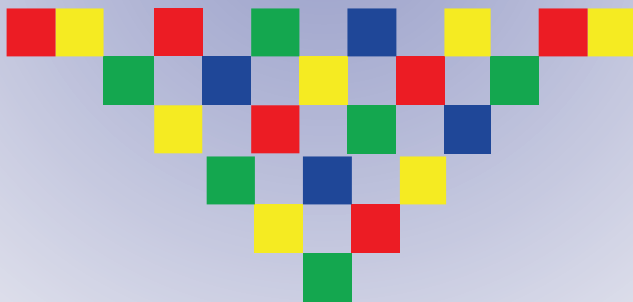

10TH ASEAN YOUTH CULTURAL FORUM

IN BRIEF:

To promote ASEAN culture as a way of fostering regional solidarity and identity – as emphasised by the ASEAN Vision 2020 – the ASEAN Youth Cultural Forum has become the AUN's annual activity dedicated to young people who are talented in dance, music and song. The activity aims to bring together cultures and traditions from the ASEAN countries for participants to share. In addition, the forum is designed to present a unique opportunity for ASEAN to reflect our deepest values of cultures and traditions. This forum also helps enhancement and strengthening of the mutual understanding of cultural diversity and similarity, friendship and cooperation among ASEAN Member States. Each AUN member university sends five students and one lecturer to participate in this gathering.

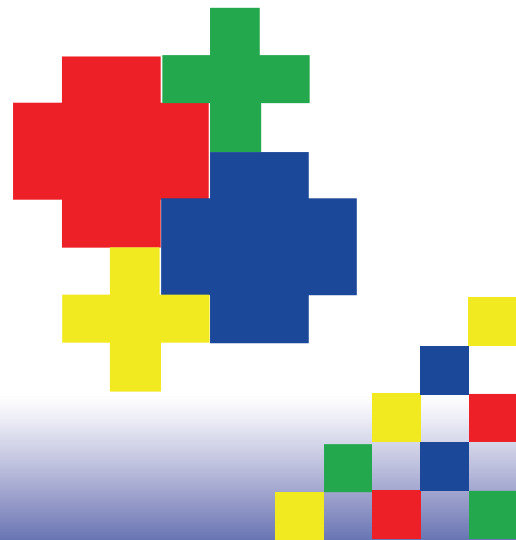
The six-day forum is composed of four main activities:

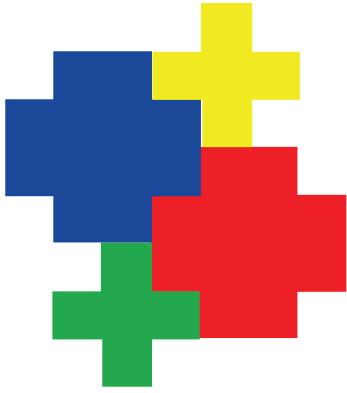
- (1) Lectures on music, song and dance:** The participants will be given lectures on the evolution of songs, dances and music in Southeast Asia, in order for them to gain the basic idea of Southeast Asia performing arts.
- (2) Consolidating workshop:** The workshop on the collaborative work of ASEAN performing arts. Participants will be given a chance to learn and trained by the host country an exclusive piece of their performing arts.
- (3) Cultural performances:** Each group of student representatives is requested to produce their own cultural performances. These performances may range from singing and dancing to some form of contemporary performing arts.
- (4) Cultural trip:** The trip will offer the participants a great chance to explore the host country's culture and traditions.
- (5) Gala night:** Resulting from the six day activities, all participants will together present a finale performance at the closing ceremony.

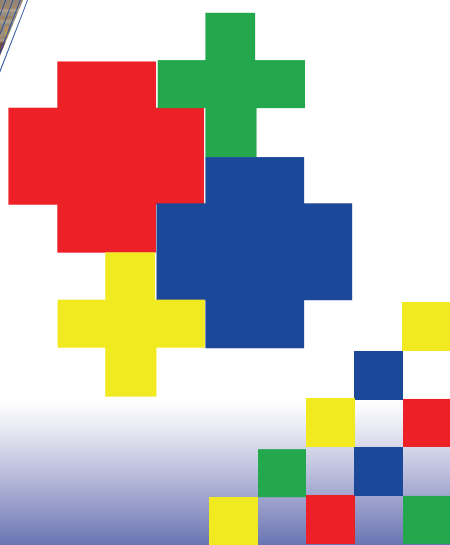
The **10th ASEAN Youth Cultural Forum** was kindly hosted by Universiti Brunei Darussalam on 6-11 October 2012 under the theme "Unity through Diversity".

DELIVERABLES:

At the forum, the national traditions and mutual understanding on the similarities and differences of ASEAN's arts and cultures had been shared and exchanged among 85 students and university staff from 14 AUN Member Universities in eight countries namely Brunei, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Viet Nam. The students not only had an opportunity to showcase their national performances; but they also joined in a contemporary grand finale specially composed by the Universiti Brunei Darussalam.







STUDY AND VISIT JAPAN'S MODERNIZATION AND POST WAR EXPERIENCE 2013

In partnership with Okayama University and MEXT

IN BRIEF:

Okayama university (International Centre) has been conducting MEXT-sponsored (Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology) short stay, short visit (SSSV) programme for the last two years. In partnership with the ASEAN university network (AUN), this year's "Study and Visit Japan's Modernization and Post War Experience 2013" gave 29 ASEAN students the opportunity to visit and learn the modernization process of Japan after its war experiences focusing on the Meiji restoration process, experiences of democratization and reconstruction of the nation.

The study and visit programme included the following itineraries: Kyoto, Okayama, Kurashiki, Satosho, Ohkunoshima Island, Kure, Hiroshima, Miyajima, Ohtsushima Island, Shimonoseki and Hagi on 15-22 March 2013. The scholarship covered for the land arrangement of students including accommodation, kits, food, stipend and bus transportation in Japan within the inclusive dates.

With the strong and good relations between ASEAN and Japan, the programme aimed to showcase the culture, traditions and the people of Japan to the ASEAN students to further strengthen its people to people relationship. It also served as a venue to learn from the experiences of Japan's modernization as a model for development for the ASEAN member countries. In addition, it is also a good opportunity for the ASEAN students to get to meet Japanese people and at the same time, chance to get to know other ASEAN students as well. Lastly, the programme was a very good venue for networking and building long lasting friendships with the future leaders of the region.



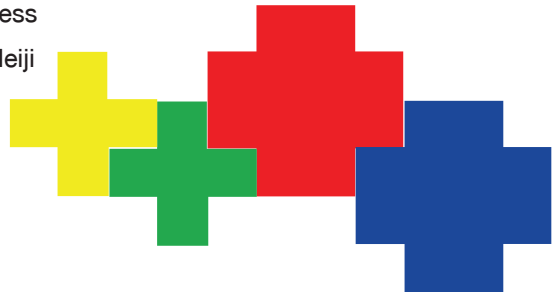

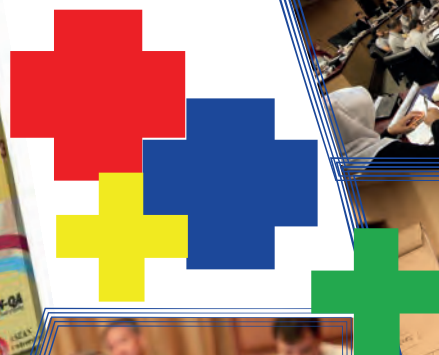
AUN-QA TRAINING COURSE FOR ACCOMPLISHING PROGRAMME ASSESSMENT

ASEAN University Network - Quality Assurance (AUN-QA) System was established since 1998. Since its inception, AUN-QA System has been the standard system practiced within the AUN Member Universities. To date, AUN-QA System has been continuously developed into the internationally recognised quality assurance system in higher education institutions.

ASEAN University Network (AUN) announces the AUN-QA Training Course for Accomplishing Programme Assessment. The 4-day course aims to introduce the AUN-QA system and enhance the QA system and development at of the participants. This comprehensive training programme is meant for professionals who are in charge of quality assurance at programme and/ or institutional level from universities (both public and private) in the region.

Upon completion of three training courses, the trainees will obtain the AUN-QA Training Certificates to be used for further QA references. The upcoming AUN Quality Assessment at Programme Level granted to non-AUN member universities, preferences will be given to those who implement the AUN-QA System at their own university.

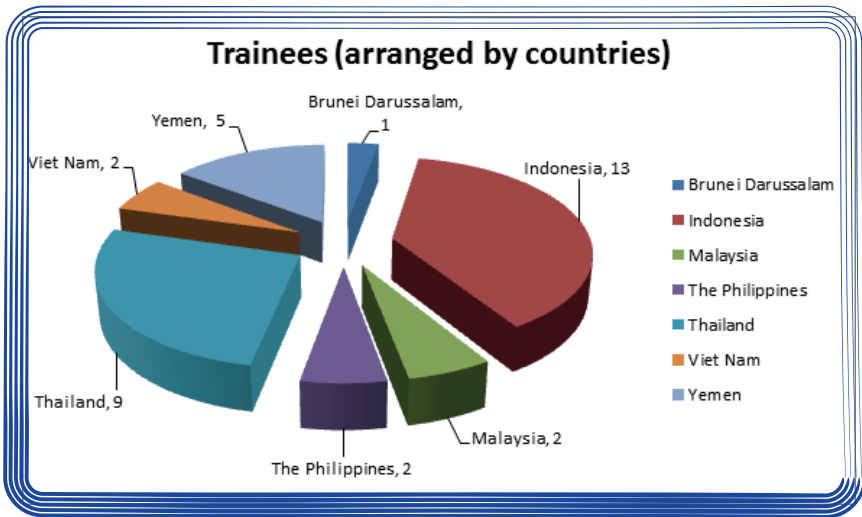

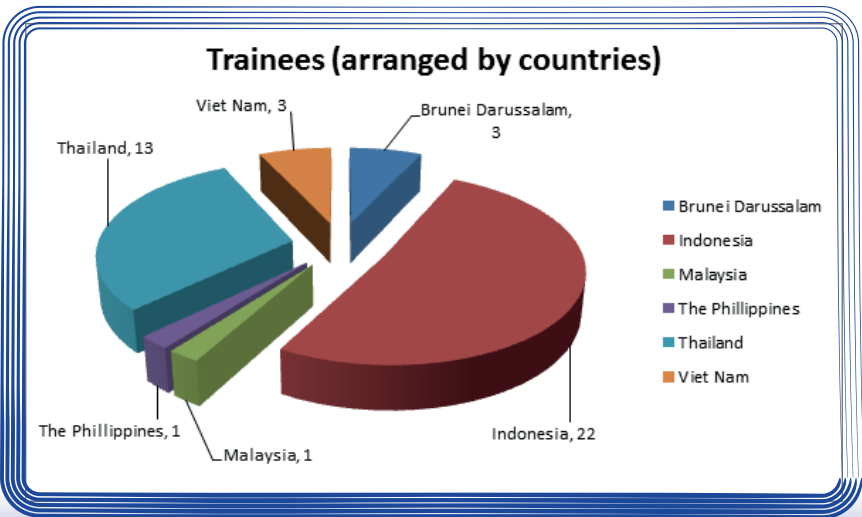

DIES ASEAN-QA Project – a joint initiative by AUN, ASEAN Quality Assurance Network (AQAN), German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), ENQA, HRK, SEAMEO-RIHED – aims at strengthening the capacity for internal and external quality assurance (IQA and EQA) through dialogue and training events for ASEAN QA professionals based on regional standards. Higher education gains more and more strategic relevance for the viability of national and regional economic systems.

Higher education today is characterised by universities' competition for the best students and researchers, and by the need for developing and sustaining high quality services at institutional and national / regional levels.



The DIES ASEAN-QA Project's Current development goals refer to international competitiveness in order to prevent brain drain of Asian high performing students and researchers. 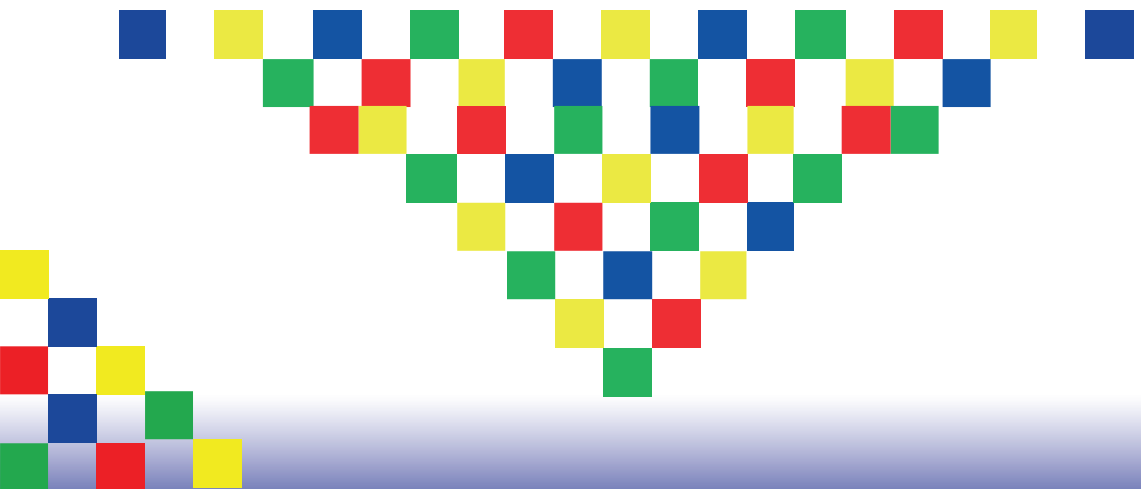
SUSTAINABLE ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENT FORUM (SEE FORUM)

IN BRIEF:

The Sustainable Energy and Environment Forum (SEE Forum) is an Asia-Pacific academic forum focusing on science and technology, particularly the issues of energy security and environmental issues. The Forum was established in response to the call for a network of Asian academic communities in science and technology. Then, New Energy Initiative expressed during the 2nd Sustainable Energy and Environment Conference in 2006, Bangkok. Since its establishment, the SEE Forum has convened meetings annually to strengthen academic cooperation, develop research-based network and enhancing its role in shaping sustainable energy policies.

Participating countries, including ASEAN Member countries, China, Japan, Republic of Korea and India, have designated an institution serving as Country Coordinator and the focal point for National SEE Forum with Kyoto University, Japan, as the main coordinator of SEE Forum activities in cooperation with the AUN.

The 10th SEE Forum and the 1st conference on Future Energy were held at Universiti Brunei Darussalam on 21 – 22 November 2012. There were 14 participants from SEE Forum members outside Japan and 11 participants from Japan. The meeting was opened by Prof. Susumu Yoshikawa, the SEE Forum Chairman, followed by the explanation of the previous 9th SEE Forum by Prof. Budit Fungtamassan from JGSEE-KMUTT, Thailand.

Currently, the conference papers are being edited and are expected to be published by the end of this year.

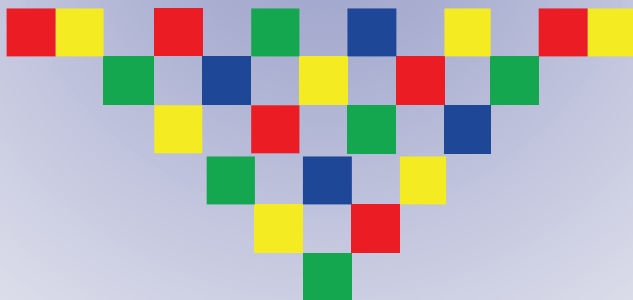

As of March 2013, **84** students were accepted to study in AUN Member Universities under ACTS scheme.

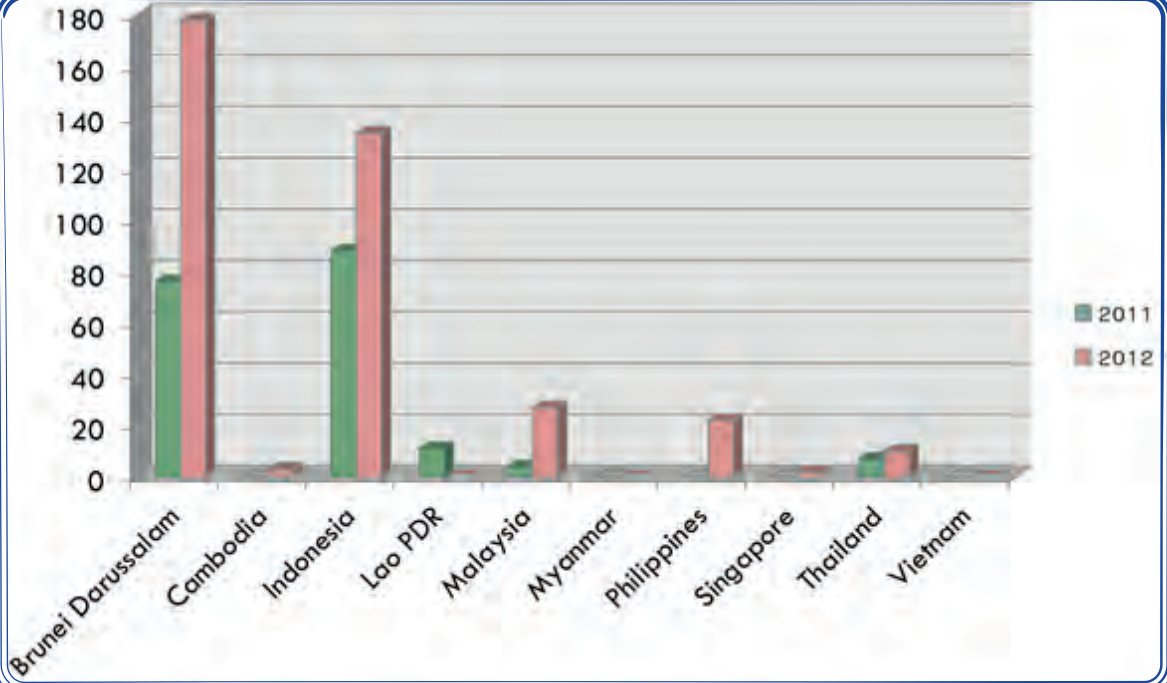

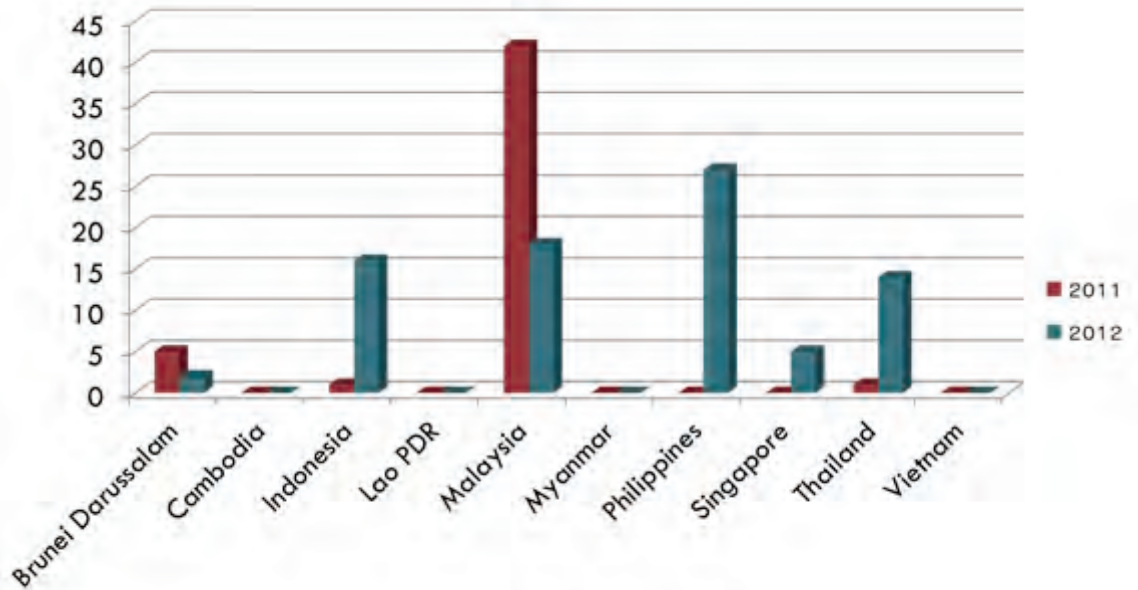

AUN ACTUAL QUALITY ASSESSMENTS AT PROGRAMME LEVEL

The AUN Actual Quality Assessment at Programme level was initiated in 2007 and implemented on a voluntary basis. Its goal is to build a better quality in the core activities of teaching and learning in order to achieve the QA framework for the university.

4TH AUN RECTORS' MEETING

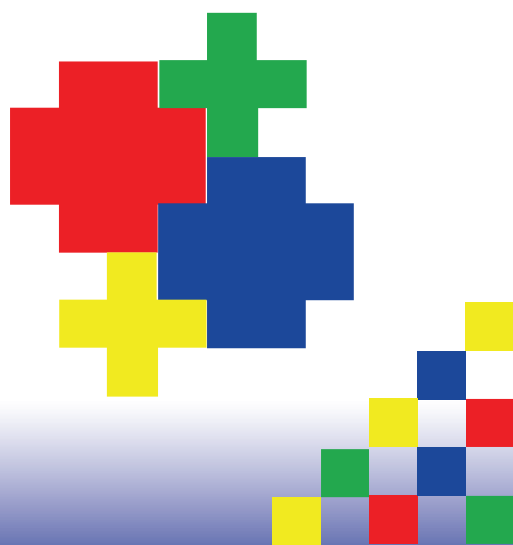
IN BRIEF:

AUN Rectors' Meeting is an AUN Policy Forum held annually back to back with the AUN Board of Trustees Meeting, the AUN Rectors' Meeting is organised in a closed session for 26 Presidents/Rectors/Vice-chancellors of AUN Member Universities only, and focus on an internal policy matters. The meeting also aims to render the rare opportunity for all member universities to become acquainted with each other, promote the universities networking, and improve the mutual cooperation among the AUN Member Universities.

The 4th AUN Rectors' Meeting was held on 11 July 2012 and was hosted by University Malaya in Putrajaya, Malaysia. The meeting focused on the preparation for ASEAN Plus Three Rectors' Conference addressed the AUN milestones in ASEAN+3 higher education cooperation and the feasibility of further enhancing our cooperation in accordance with the cooperation plans for the various existing frameworks.

The 3rd Meeting was hosted by National University of Singapore on 19–20 July 2012. The meeting provided opportunity for the participants to examine and evaluate on the past records of AUN youth activities and also the prospects and possibilities for the enhancement of the network's programmes and activities related to students, both academic and non-academic.

DELIVERABLES:

- A platform for experience sharing and exchange of ideas on AUN Student Mobility
- The collective idea on cooperation in Retrospect and the Prospect of Student Mobility in East Asia based on 7 AUN Youth Activities shows below;

1. MODEL OF ASEAN-KOREAN YOUTHS' ASIAN CROSS-CULTURAL EXPLORATION (ACCE) CAMP PROGRAMME

Suggestions:

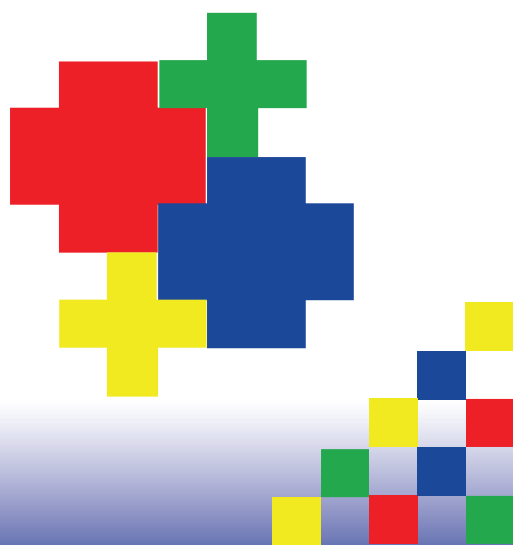

3RD ASEM RECTORS' CONFERENCE "UNIVERSITIES, BUSINESS AND YOU: FOR A SUSTAINABLE FUTURE"

IN BRIEF:

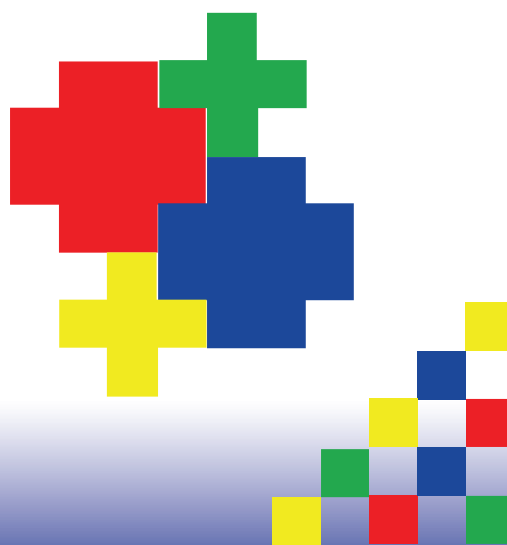
In response to the 1st ASEM Conference of Ministers of Education (ASEMME), the 1st ASEM Rectors' Conference (ARC1) was initiated in 2008, with an aim to establish a sustainable dialogue platform for the education between Asia and Europe, since then, the ASEM Rectors' Conference is agreed to convene biennial and designed as the platform for heads of universities and higher education institutions to discuss issues of higher education and enhance education co-operation among ASEM Countries.

A series of biennial conferences has been scheduled follows:

DELIVERABLES:

- The ARC3 was co-organised by Asia Europe foundation (ASEF) with the University of Groningen (RUG) and the ASEAN University Network (AUN) in the Netherlands on 24-28 September 2012.
- The meeting was attended by over 93 heads of universities and higher education institutions from 38 Asian and European countries.
- This ARC3 was the first time that the meeting organised back-to-back with 1st Asia – Europe Students' Forum. The Forum provided a platform for students to share their views and opinions on the topics "Are You Fit for the Future".
- A Conference Recommendation was submitted at the 4th Asia-Europe Meeting of Ministers for Education (ASEMME4) in Malaysia on 13-14 May 2013.
- A publication compiling the Conference proceedings and results.
- The meeting agreed that the ARC4 will be held in Thailand in 2014 and hosted by the Office of Higher Education commission (OHEC) and Chulalongkorn University.



1ST ASEAN+3 RECTORS' CONFERENCE

IN BRIEF:

Under the ASEAN+3 Cooperation, the ASEAN University Network is tasked to promote higher education cooperation, increase linkages between universities and encourage credit transfers in ASEAN+3 countries. In realisation of this vital mission, the “ASEAN+3 Higher Education Policy Dialogue” was successfully convened in Phuket, Thailand in March 2009 with full support by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Thailand, the Office of Higher Education Commission (OHEC), Thailand and the AUN Secretariat.

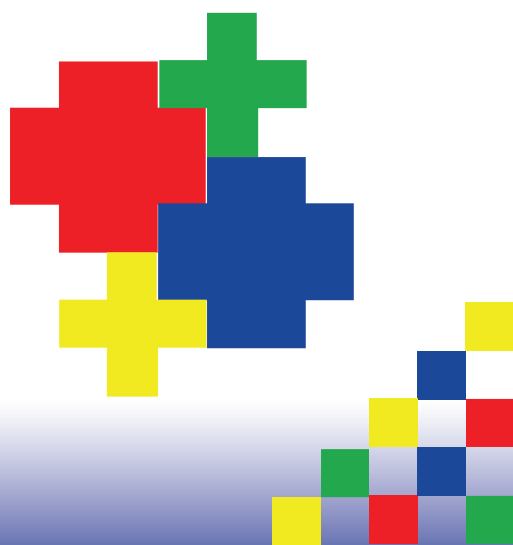
As a result, the conference participants agreed to establish an ASEAN+3 University Network (ASEAN+3 UNet) and the organisation of ASEAN+3 Rectors' Conference.

Subsequently to this agreement, the 1st ASEAN+3 Rectors' Conference was hosted and organised by Peking University on 1 November 2012 in Beijing. The Meeting was attended by Presidents, Rectors, Vice-Chancellors, and representatives of the 21 AUN Member Universities from Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Viet Nam, and 7 member universities from the People's Republic of China, Japan and the Republic of Korea. The representatives from the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, Japan, The Office of Higher Education Commission (OHEC), Thailand, the ASEAN Secretariat were also attended.

DELIVERABLES:

On the occasion of the first inaugural of the ASEAN+3 Rectors' Conference, the Presidents, Rectors, Vice-Chancellors and representatives of the AUN and the Plus Three Member Universities were invited to

- Sign the MOU for an establishment of the ASEAN+3 University Network (ASEAN+3 UNet)
- Discuss on the Terms of Reference (TOR) of the ASEAN+3 University Network to be put into effect after the MOU signing
- The agreement to convene the ASEAN+3 Rectors' Conference biennially, thus, the 2nd ASEAN+3 Rectors' Conference will be hosted by Chiang Mai University, Thailand in 2014.



THE INAUGURAL MEETING OF THE AUN-KYOTO STUDENT MOBILITY PROGRAMME TOWARDS HUMAN SECURITY DEVELOPMENT (HSD)

IN BRIEF:

Kyoto University, 6 departments (Graduate School of Energy Science, Graduate School of Agriculture, Graduate School of Asian Africa Area Studies, Graduate School of Medicine and Public Health, Institute of Advanced Energy, and Center for Southeast Asian Studies) collaborated with AUN to develop the proposal in promoting Human Security Development, by aiming to provide the common subject on HSD and special subjects including those of Energy & Environment, Foods & water resources, and Public Health.

The Proposal on AUN-Kyoto Student Mobility Programme towards Human Security Development Project was then later approved and endorsed for financial supported by the Ministry of Education, Cultural, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT), Japan, under the “Re-inventing Japan Project (2012-2017)”.

In order to publicize and discuss the concept of this innovative new programme, the Inaugural Meeting for the AUN-Kyoto Student Mobility Programme toward Human Security Development was organised on 22 January 2013 at Kyoto University, Kyoto, Japan.

The Meeting was attended by executives and representatives of the five key implementing AUN Member Universities, namely: Chulalongkorn University, Institute Teknologi Bandung, National University of Singapore, Universitas Gadjah Mada, Universiti Malaya, together with Kyoto University, and the Executive Director of AUN.

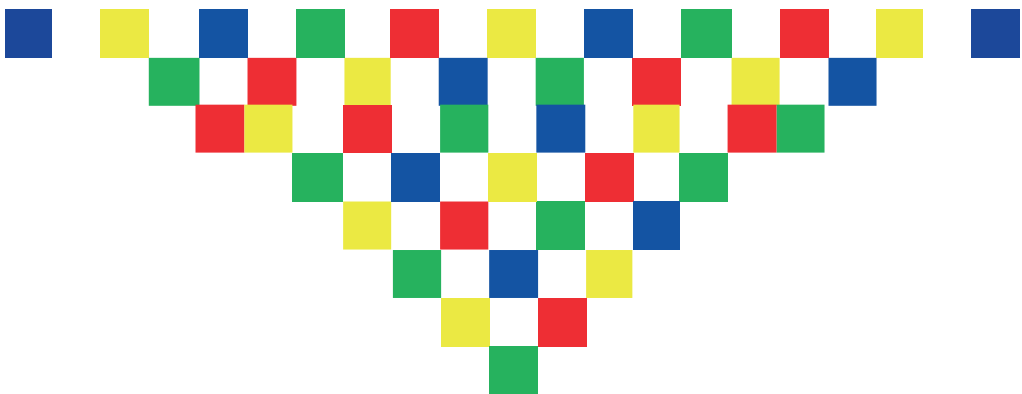

The meeting discussed the following agendas

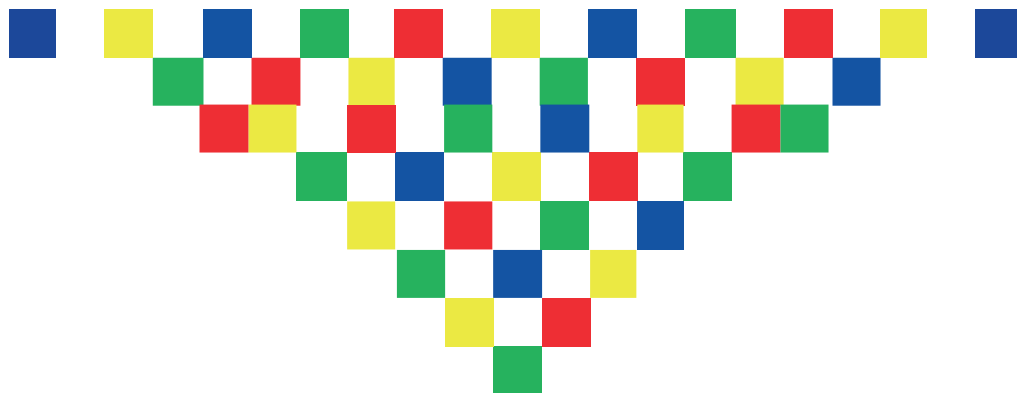

3RD STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING

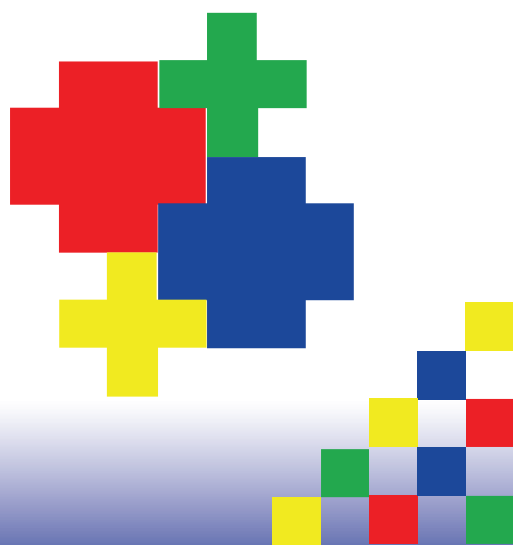
IN BRIEF:

The 3rd Steering Committee Meeting on an establishment of the ASEAN Cyber University hosted by Institute of Technology of Cambodia, was held back to back with the ACU Working Group Meeting on 4-5 April 2013 in Phnom Penh. As follow up to the 2nd Steering Committee Meeting, the 3rd meeting took more focus on the 2013 ACU Work Plan and the draft of ACU Establishment Plan. Progress reports of the 2012 ACU project result, which were presented by the representatives of the four host universities in CLMV was also widely discussed in order to take stock of the different successful stories and obstruction of each member institute to be used as a general evaluation for project improvement.

DELIVERABLES:

The ACU Secretariat presented the ACU Working Plan in 2013 regarding the ACU course operation plan, contents development plan, ACU non-degree programme, Hub Center operation, international cooperation and ACU support for e-learning center. To provide more support for the ACU courses development and e-learning center, the ACU Secretariat will discuss with the Ministry of Education, ROK and keep the member institutes informed of the progress at the next meeting.

The ACU Secretariat also presented the draft of ACU Establishment Plan to be fully operated in 2015. The draft plan included time frame which lies ahead for ACU 2015, location of ACU headquarter, system and infrastructure, legal framework, budget plan, and curriculum management. After an extensive exchange of discussion among the Steering Committee members regarding the above details, it was agreed that the draft plan should be revised by the ACU Secretariat in consultation with the committee members, advisers and experts before further review at the next Steering Committee Meeting.

IN BRIEF:

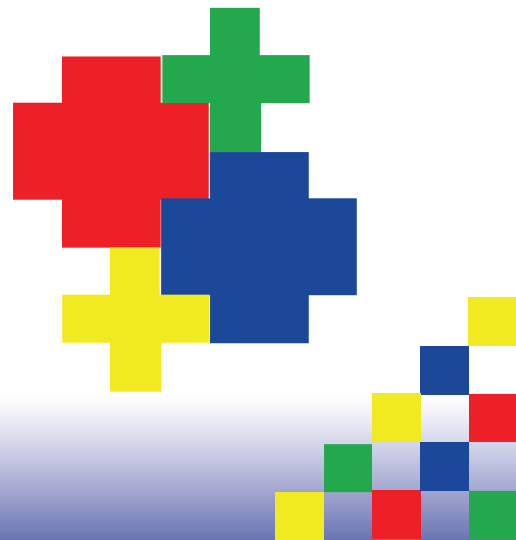
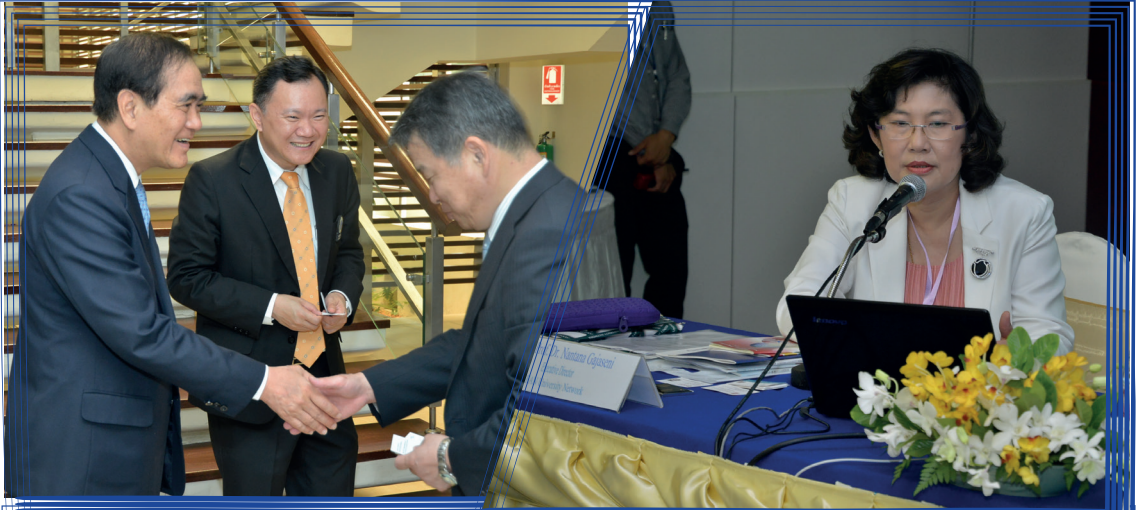

DELIVERABLES:

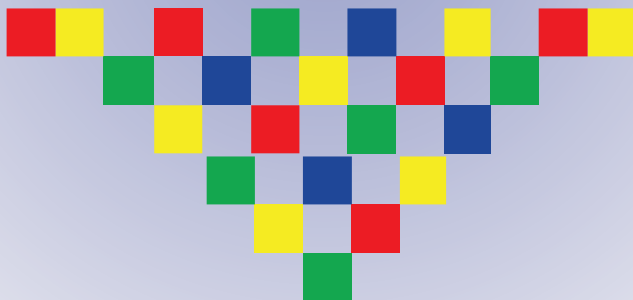
- The meeting was attended by 13 Vice Presidents from AUN Member Universities and 6 Vice Presidents from Japan National Universities (SUN/SixERS)

AUN Thematic Network will widen opportunities for non-AUN Member Universities to have chance to participate in different collaborative area under the auspices of AUN. Up to present, 8 thematic networks have been established;

- (1)** AUN–Quality Assurance (AUN–QA): the development of a quality assurance system as an instrument for maintaining, improving, and enhancing teaching, research and the overall institutional academic standards of higher education institutions.
- (2)** ASEAN Graduate Business/Economics Programme Network (AGBEP): a collaboration among graduate business and economics programmes.
- (3)** AUN–Southeast Asia Engineering Education Development Network (AUN/SEED–Net): aims at promoting human resources development in the field of engineering in close cooperation with Japanese Universities.
- (4)** ASEAN Credit Transfer System (ACTS): the creation of the common credit transfer mechanism in facilitating student and academic mobility in ASEAN.
- (5)** AUN Universities Social Responsibility and Sustainability (AUN–USR& S): a network of university's collaboration on the promotion of social responsibility and community engagement.
- (6)** AUN Inter–Library Online (AUNILO): the establishment and development of on–line information exchange systems among libraries of AUN Member Universities.
- (7)** AUN Human Rights Education Network (AUN–HREN): the promotion on education and research opportunities in the area of human rights in order to contribute to ASEAN initiatives on human rights and related fields in ASEAN.
- (8)** AUN Intellectual Property Network (AUNIP): the enhancement of IP knowledge in the region through the organisation of workshops/ conferences and establishing relationship with other IP networks.

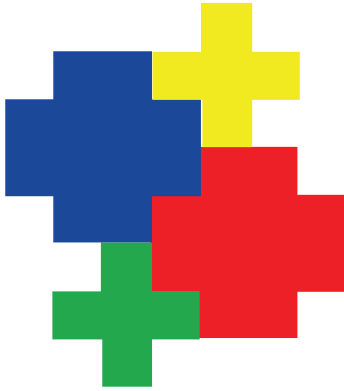

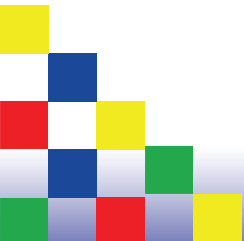

IN BRIEF:

The 13th Annual Meeting of AGBEP Network and Conference entitled “Enhancing Collaboration, People, and Institutions within the ASEAN–China Community Network: Facing the ASEAN Economic Community (AEC) 2015” was hosted by Universitas Gadjah Mada on 2–3 April 2013 in Yogyakarta, Indonesia. The meeting and conference was attended by 45 participants, deans, representatives, students and observers from 8 AGBEP Institutional Members from Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore and Thailand, the AGBEP Secretariat, the AUN Secretariat and observers from non–AUN Member Universities and Chinese universities.

Handover Ceremony of Secretariat

In 2013, the AGBEP secretariat was transferred from Graduate Business School, De La Salle University to the Faculty of Economics and Business, Universitas Gadjah Mada. The handover ceremony was witnessed by the AUN Secretariat, AGBEP Institutional Members and local participants. The term of secretariat, chairperson and internal network management will be later discussed and put in the AGBEP Terms of Reference.

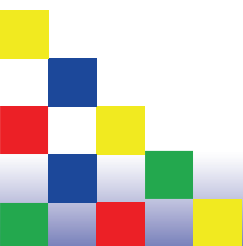
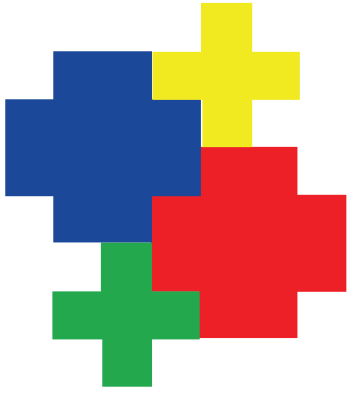
AGBEP Conference

THE LAUNCHING OF ASEAN-CHINA BUSINESS SCHOOL NETWORK AND THE FIRST MEETING OF ASEAN-CHINA BUSINESS SCHOOL NETWORK (ACBSN)

IN BRIEF:

Universitas Gadjah Mada with the support of the ASEAN Foundation organized the Launching of ASEAN-China Business School Network on 2 April 2013 in Yogyakarta, Indonesia. The ceremony was attended by AGBEP Institutional Members, Chinese universities, the ASEAN Foundation, the AUN Secretariat, Mission of the People's e Republic of China to ASEAN and observers.

The ASEAN-China Business School Network will be the platform of collaboration between AGBEP Institutional Members under AUN and Chinese business schools namely:

- Antai College of Economics and Management, Shanghai Jiao Tong University (SJTU)
- School of Management, Fudan University (FU)
- Department of Economics, School of Business, East China University of Science and Technology, Shanghai (ECST)
- China-Europe International Business School, Shanghai (CEIBS)

Structure of ACBSN

Members of the ACBSN comprises business schools from ASEAN and China which are:

- (1) Institutional Members under AGBEP Network
- (2) Chinese business schools

(Presented at the meeting are four founding members; Shanghai Jiang Tong University, Fudan University, East China University of Science and Technology, Shanghai, and China- Europe International Business School and later will be opened for more participating universities)

The meeting assigned UGM to formulate the draft of criteria and procedure for application and other criteria which related to admission of new network members.

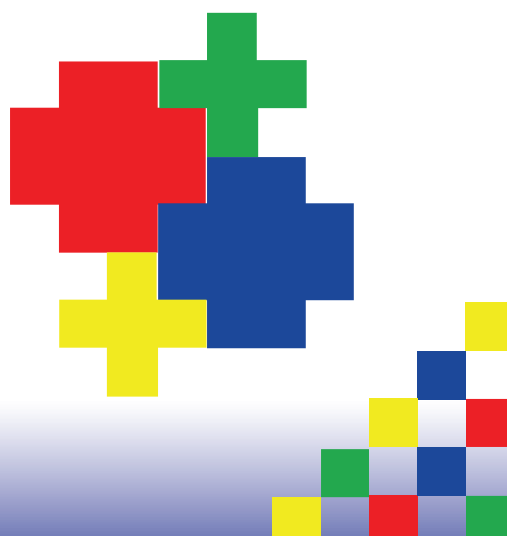
The meeting assigned UGM, as now holding AGBEP Secretariatship, to review the basic framework of the ASEAN–China Business School Network.

It also discussed on the work plan of ACBSN collaboration and came out with:

- **Short-term plan:** ACBSN will develop its own website which will be hosted at AUN website but content will be provided and developed by meeting and network members.
- **Long-term:** The network discussed about the following collaboration areas:
 - Academic mobility
 - Faculty mobility
 - Granting degree and diploma
 - Credit accreditation
 - Linkage between academia and industries
 - Research and policy studies in terms of supporting data

ASEAN UNIVERSITY NETWORK/SOUTHEAST ASIA ENGINEERING EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT NETWORK (AUN/SEED-NET)



IN BRIEF:

The AUN/SEED-Net was officially established in 2001 from the leaders' initiative derived at the ASEAN – Japan Summit as an autonomous sub-network of the ASEAN University Network (AUN). The aim of the network is to develop innovative and highly skilled human resources in engineering field for sustainable development of the ASEAN region with main support from the Japanese Government through Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) and partial support from ASEAN Foundation, the governments of the ASEAN member countries, and the member institutions.

Now AUN/SEED-Net is implementing its third phase (2013 – 2018) with expansion of members and activities. Current members comprise 26 member institutions from 10 ASEAN countries, with the support from 14 Japanese supporting universities.

Purpose of Phase III

In the AUN/SEED-Net's Phase III, region-wide system for advanced research and education should be established by member institutions in collaboration with Japanese supporting universities. Significantly, the AUN/SEED-Net seeks to promote university - industry collaboration, address the region's common issues through collaborative research, and relieve the problem of brain drain by enhancing capacity of the member institutions and the network to function as a platform for promotion of science and technology in East Asia.

Activities

The AUN/SEED-Net provides integrative supports of scholarships and grants for faculty development and network establishment. Scholars receive a package of scholarship and research funding during study and after graduation. Academic exchanges and staff mobility are promoted through several supporting programs to facilitate joint supervision of students and research collaboration. The AUN/SEED-Net also sponsors organization of regional conference to be a forum for academics, professionals, and students to exchange knowledge and technological trends, present research works, and discuss future collaboration.

These activities are performed under 10 engineering fields with certain member institutions assigned to act as Host Institutions for each field. These host institutions are responsible for training young graduates and teaching staff from other members and managing research activities in the fields, with academic assistance from Japanese supporting universities.

DELIVERABLES:

- The Final Evaluation of the AUN/SEED-Net Project's Phase II by JICA was conducted in July 2012. It revealed that the purpose of Phase II was mostly achieved with major achievements in increasing number of academic staff with higher degrees, regular organization of regional conferences, publishing of the "ASEAN Engineering Journal", MOU between the member institutions, and some progress in cost-sharing. However, there are some tasks to be furthered, including more contribution to the industry and communities, discussion on direction and feasibility of establishing regional academic societies and a "partnership university", and promotion for more cost-sharing.

- The 19th Steering Committee Meeting and Year 2012 Annual Meeting was held on 21 September 2012 in Bandung, Indonesia and co-hosted by Institut Teknologi Bandung (ITB) and the AUN/SEED-Net Secretariat. The meeting gathered 57 participants including delegates of member institutions in ASEAN, Chairman of Japanese Supporting University Consortium (JSUC), and representatives of ASEAN Secretariat (ASEC), ASEAN University Network (AUN), Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan, Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), as well as AUN/SEED-Net Secretariat. Director General of Higher Education, Ministry of Education and Culture of Indonesia and Minister-Counselor, Deputy Chief of Mission of Japan to ASEAN, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan gave honorary addresses at the opening ceremony. Main agenda were the final evaluation of the AUN/SEED-Net Project Phase II and the concept and strategic plan of Phase III.

- The Signing Ceremony of the AUN/SEED-Net Cooperative Framework was organized in Bangkok on 29 November 2012. This new Cooperative Framework was made for the operation of the AUN/SEED-Net from March 2013 onwards, identifying the structure and the expansion of the Network. The signing marked the new page of higher education collaboration in the ASEAN region where leading universities work together for socio-economic development with cooperation from the industry, which would contribute to the establishment of the ASEAN Community.

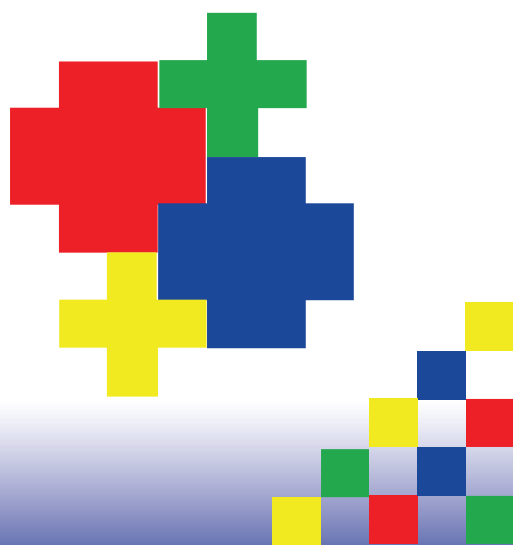
- The 1st Working Group Meeting
Considering changes in implementation of the AUN/SEED-Net's Phase III, the AUN/SEED-Net Secretariat set up the 1st Working Group Meeting on 11-12 March 2013 in Bangkok to meet and discuss operational matters with coordinators from the 26 member institutions with the purpose to ensure smooth and efficient implementation of the activities in Phase III. The meeting was chaired by Prof. Dr. Andi Isra Mahyuddin from Institut Teknologi Bandung (ITB), Indonesia.

Apart from the above activities, AUN/SEED-Net sponsored Chulalongkorn University to arrange the ASEAN - Japan Seminar and Workshop on Satellite Data Applications on Flood on 30-31 July 2012, where over 60 experts from ASEAN and Japan gathered to present their researches and to discuss research collaboration on flood-related issues. This event induced a special collaborative research on flood issues conducted by ASEAN and Japanese universities led by Chulalongkorn University.

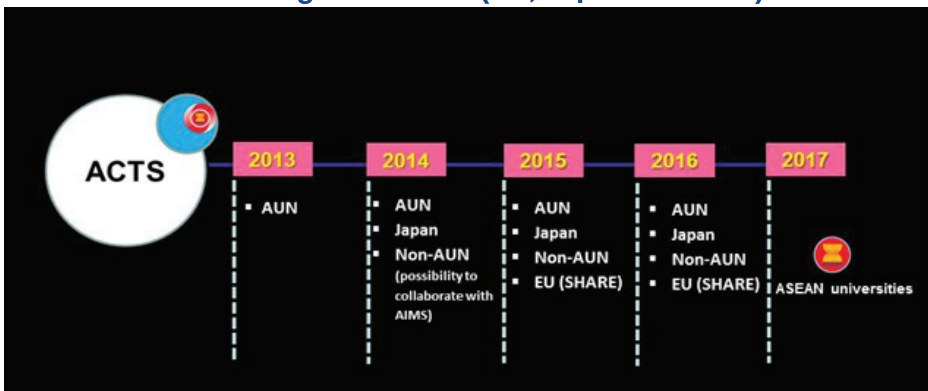
IN BRIEF:

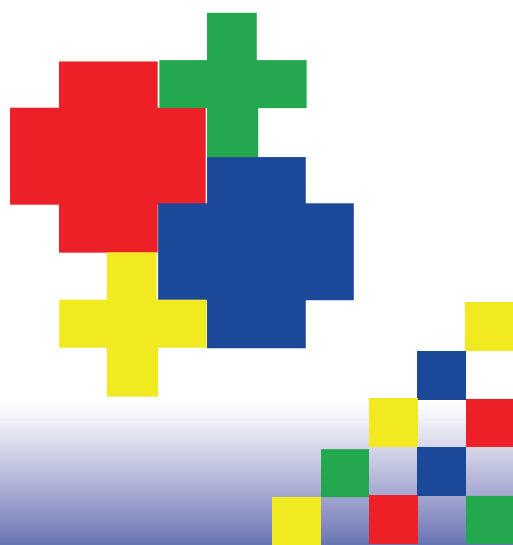


ACTS Corporate Promotional Strategy

THE 1ST AUN-USR&S STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING

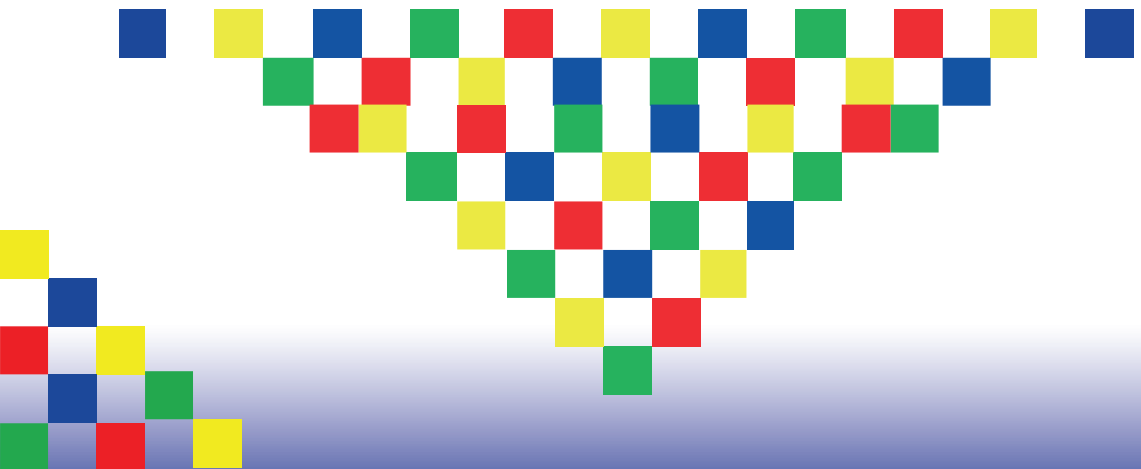
Thematic Network: AUN University Social Responsibility & Sustainability

IN BRIEF:

The ASEAN University Network's Thematic Network on University Social Responsibility & Sustainability (AUN-USR&S) was established as an enabling mechanism to achieve greater regional cooperation amongst the higher education institutions in ASEAN, to address the social, economic and environmental challenges facing communities across the region .

AUN-USR&S is one of the three entities along side the Asia-Talloires Network of Industry and Community Engaged Universities (ATNEU) and the ASEAN Youth Volunteer Programme (AYVP) that make up AsiaEngage. All three entities work synergistically to create mutually beneficial partnerships between the Research, Education and Volunteerism missions of higher education with industry and community stakeholders across ASEAN and Asia. AsiaEngage is hosted and driven by Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM). All initiatives undertaken by the AUN-USR&S Thematic Network at UKM will be guided by the AUN-USR&S Conceptual Framework, which is based on the four integral components; Higher Education's Missions, University's Governance and Administration, Community Involvement and Campus Life.

As the first step towards developing clear systems and structures to move forward the plan and initiatives under AUN-USR&S, the first AUN-USR&S Steering Committee meeting was held at Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia from 15-16 October 2012. The meeting was attended by 18 Steering Committees, 5 Associate Members of the AUN- USR&S, 22 AUN Member Universities, representatives from the AUN Secretariat, the Thailand Research Fund (TRF). Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UiTM) and the Higher Education Leadership Academy (AKEPT), the Ministry of Higher Education, Malaysia.



The 2-day meeting and group work came up with following key outcomes:

1) Institutionalisation

There is a need to develop systems and processes for quality engagement within the university and with external stakeholders. Universities have to define it in connection with the university's mission. In addition, a template needs to be developed for all universities to identify where community engagement is located across universities in ASEAN. This is because different universities across ASEAN have different units that works closely with the community. By clearly locating the responsibility with the relevant offices and with the appropriate officials in the university, a clear picture of how community engagement has been institutionalized can be examined for purposes of audit review. Also, there is a need to include community and industry engagement in promotional systems for academic staff and credits worked out for students involved in community and industry engagement initiatives.

2) Research

Universities are moving towards embedding community engagement within research, teaching and learning and service, the core mission of the university. Academics are now encouraged to work through research-driven community engagement so that they can measure the impact of the work that is being carried out in partnership with multi-sector stakeholders to solve problems facing the communities. This evidence based data helps convince future donors of the value of the work and also contributes to the development of the scholarship of community engagement. At the core of all community-engaged research, however, is the understanding that the community will be involved in a meaningful way.

3) Scholarship of Engagement

It is essential that the scholarship of engagement is developed. Academics who work in this field must ensure that their community and industry engagement is research-driven and publications are of quality.

4) Quality Assurance

Quality assurance ensures transparency, accountability and sustainability for all stakeholders, enables transfer of values (of community engagement) to students and other stakeholders and establishes systematic management with the same set of standards applied in institutions across ASEAN.

5) Capacity Building

There needs to be courses provided to enable these skills to be developed. The following are some of the examples of the areas essential for capacity development –community engagement experts, platforms for sharing of best practices and site visits, community-based exchange programmes for student and credits option for students who learn through community based initiatives.

6) Collaboration

The network should have collaboration with potential strategic partners, amongst universities by identifying the strength of different universities.

7) Funding

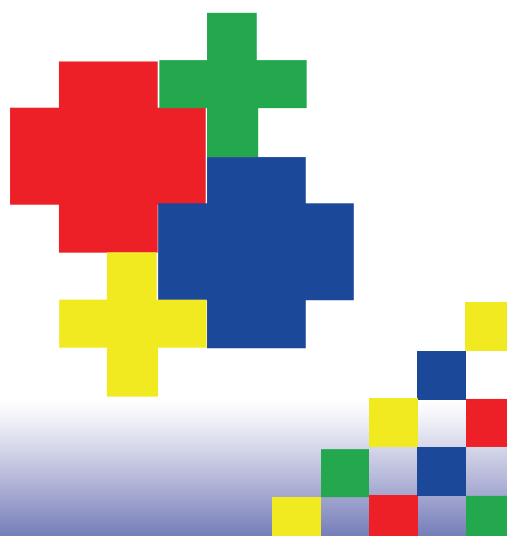
Substantial effort to tap diverse funding sources and to develop innovative mechanisms through strategic public-private partnerships is crucial to ensure sustainability of community engaged initiatives.

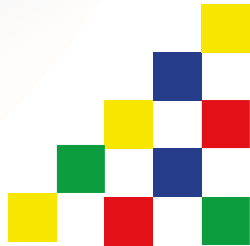
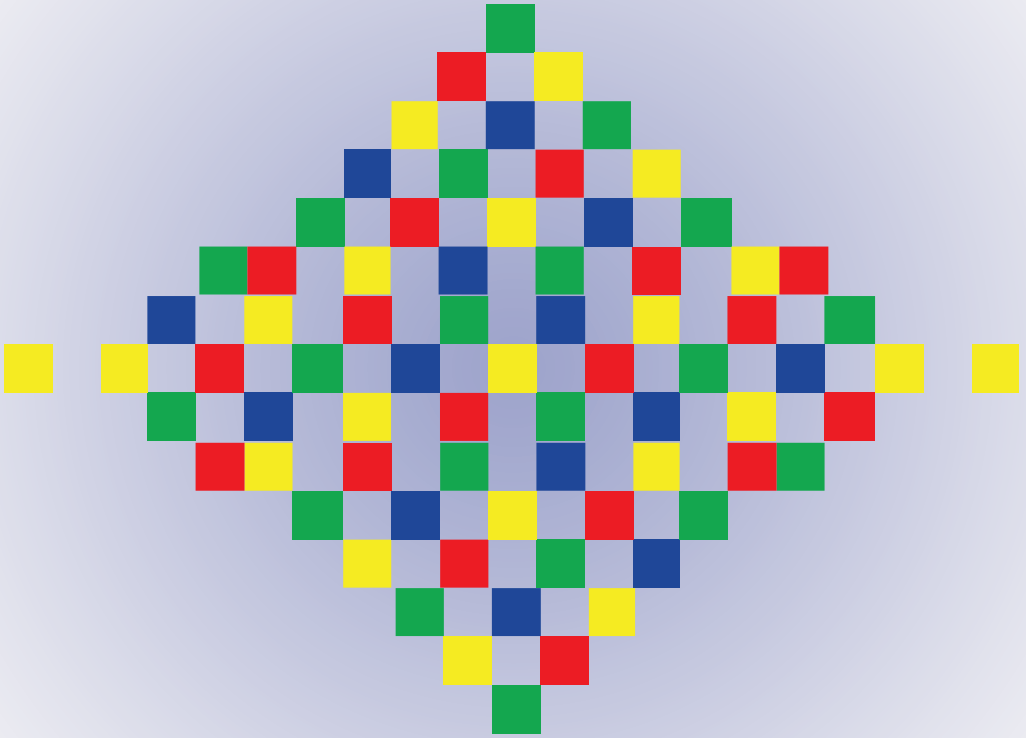
8) Regional Awards

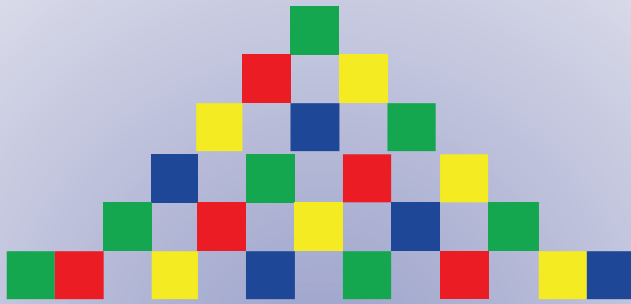

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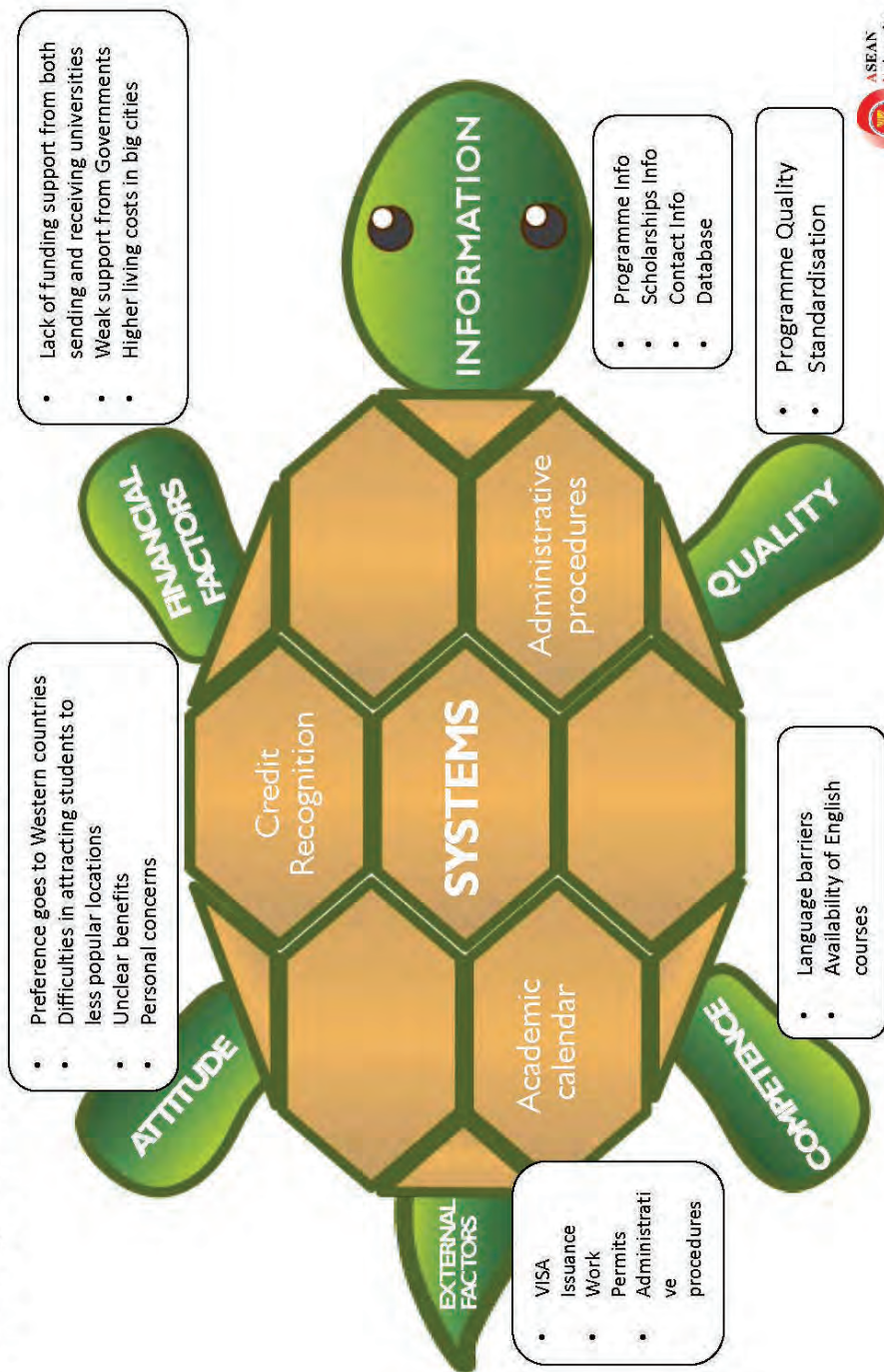

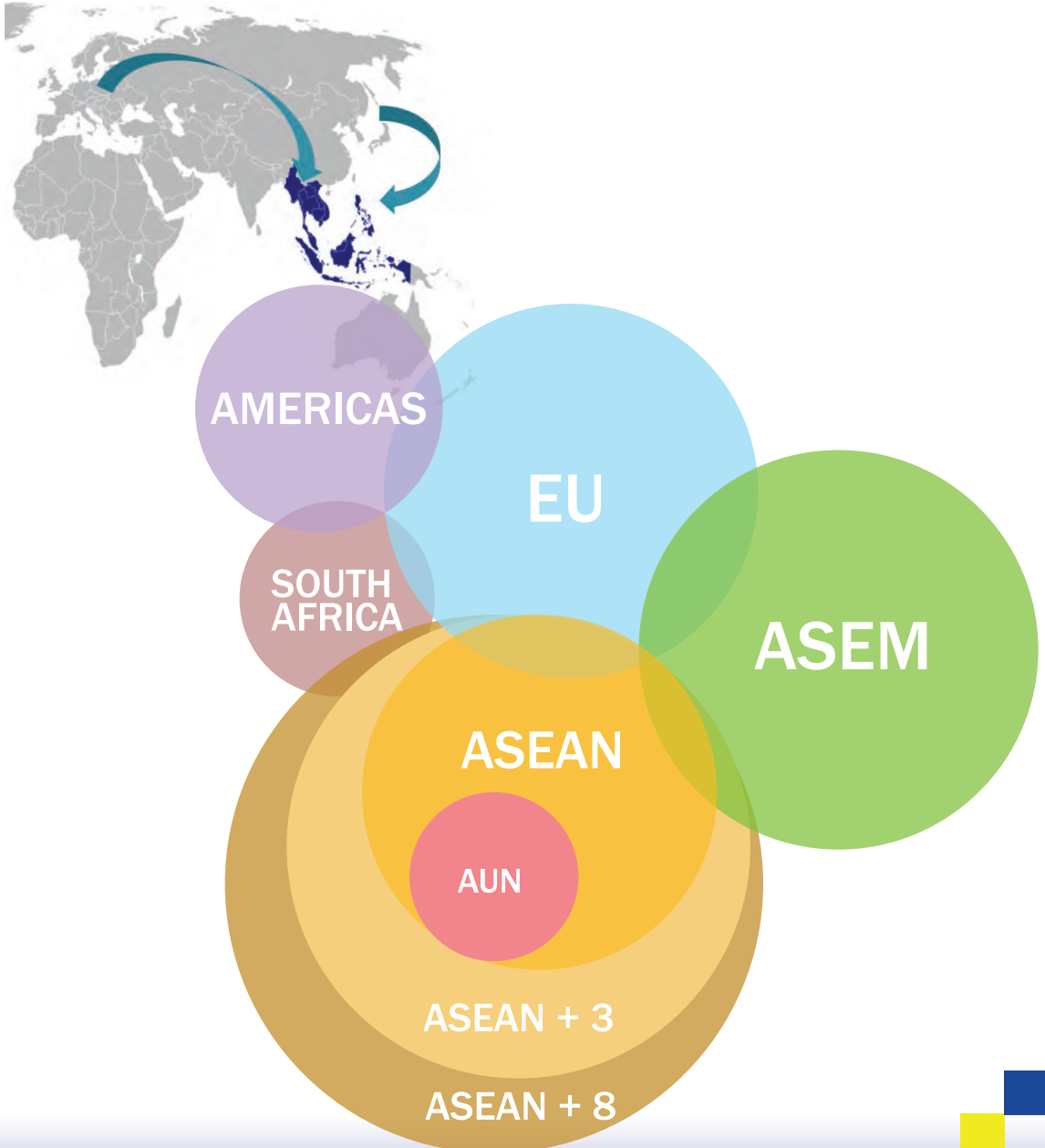

WHAT IS ACTS?

ACTS comprises 3 components:

- Grading scales
- Online list of available courses
- Online application system

ACTS will be a student-centered system based on students' workloads in terms of the achievement of learning outcomes. The system has been designed in order to accommodate differences in use among AUN universities in grading conversion systems when students participate in the exchange programme at an AUN Member University for the duration of 1 -2 semesters.

How does the ACTS work?

By applying for the ACTS, credits that students earn during the exchange study at the Host University will be collected and will be automatically transferred back to the Home University the exchange period ends.

- Students will receive the credits assigned from a course that they earn in the Host University during the exchange period.

Step 1: Getting started

1. Go to the ACTS website <http://acts.ui.ac.id/>
2. Choose your preferred courses that are available up to 12,270 courses
(please see the **Academic Calendar** of the host university that match with your university)

Home University means the university of student's origin, sending university

Information as of March 2012

3. Register to the online system and complete the application form
4. Print and send the application form to the International Relations Office (or any authorized body) at your university, along with the supporting documents to be reviewed
5. Wait for the confirmation and approval from Host University (your destination), the confirmation and notification email will be sent to you approximately within one month

(Note: students who meet the criteria set up by the host will be selected to participate in the exchange programme)

Step 2: When your application has been approved by Host University

1. Download the “Learning agreement” at <http://acts.ui.ac.id/>
2. Complete and have your “Learning agreement” document signed
3. Upload the completed agreement with signature of applicant and faculty Dean or authorized person to the ACTS system

After the end of the exchange programme

Students will receive the Certificate and ACTS Transcript of Record. Credits that you have earned during the programme will be transferred to your academic transcript.

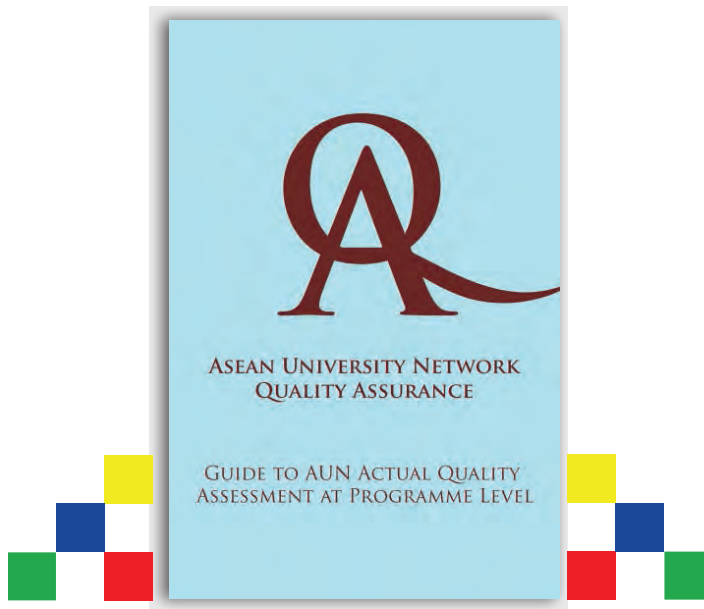

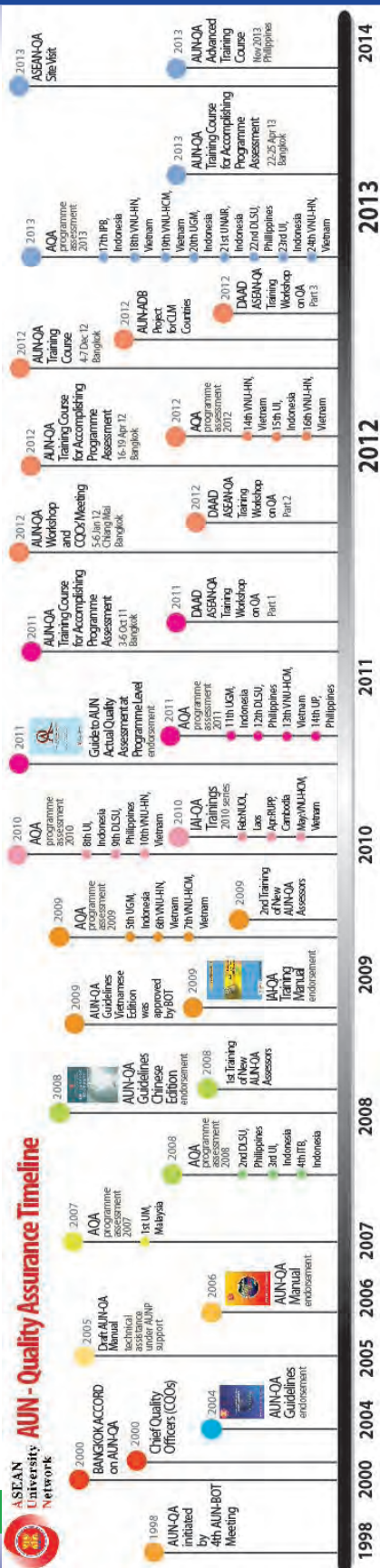
THE AUN-QA GUIDELINES AND MANUAL



The AUN-QA Guidelines and Manual have served well as a tool for AUN member universities to implement and assess their quality and quality assurance system since their publication in 2004-2006. The AUN-QA Manual has also been translated into Chinese and Vietnamese edition. In 2011, AUN established an AUN-QA Documentation Review Committee and Procedure to keep its documents updated and relevant. The original AUN-QA for programme level was revised to enhance implementation and assessment efficiency and effectiveness. The revised AUN-QA model for programme level encompasses the following 15 criteria:

1. Expected learning outcomes
2. Programme specification
3. Programme structure and content
4. Teaching and learning strategy
5. Student assessment
6. Academic staff quality
7. Support staff quality
8. Student quality
9. Student advice and support
10. Facilities and infrastructure
11. Quality assurance of teaching and learning process
12. Staff development activities
13. Stakeholders feedback
14. Output
15. Stakeholders satisfaction

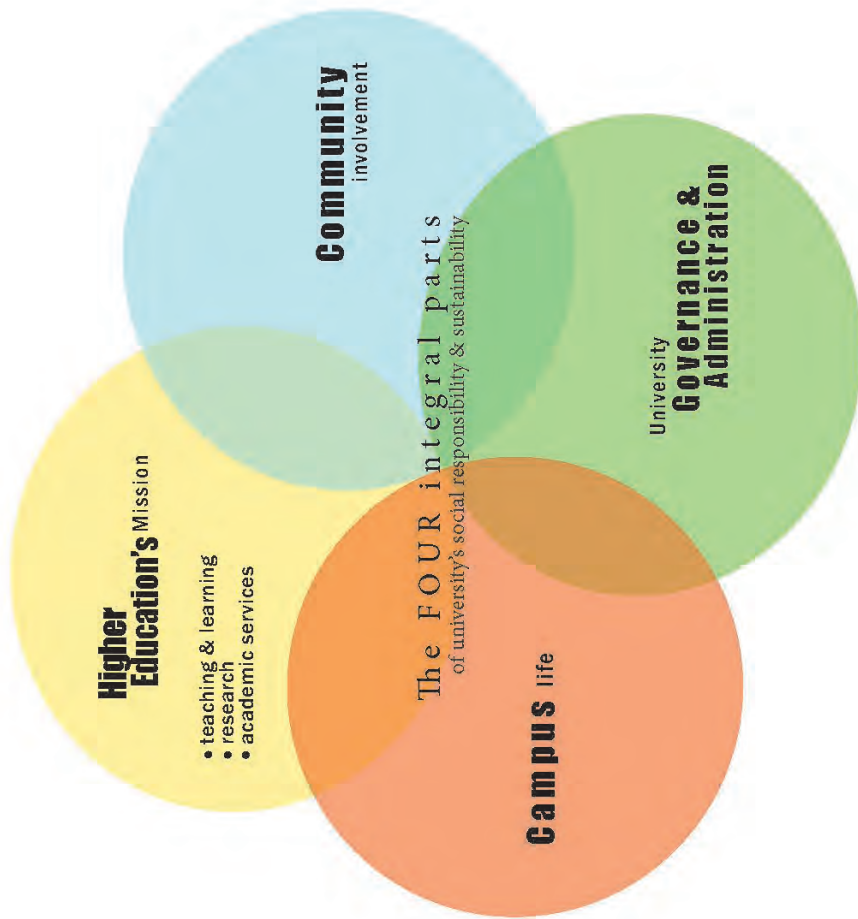
